

140 West Highway 246 As Library Director for Santa Barbara County Zone 1, I am writing to you today requesting increased funding for the libraries within Santa Barbara County. As you know, libraries across Santa Barbara County provide tremendous benefit to the communities they serve. As your Library Director, I am asking that you support increased funding to ensure continued equal access to information and a culture of lifelong learning.

It pays to support library funding. An investment in libraries is an investment in education, lifelong learning, and our community's future. Indeed, libraries are among the 1102 E. Montecito St. most effective of all public services, providing a variety of services to more than 2/3 of the public using less than 2% of all tax dollars. For every tax dollar invested in libraries, there is an average return of \$4 in services to patrons, the community, and the economy. Our local libraries have a long history of supporting early literacy education and play a key role in helping children become ready to read and ready for school. In addition, libraries engage in many partnerships with community agencies in order to extend local services and programs.

As your Zone 1 Library Director, I ask that you support libraries in Santa Barbara County by increasing the current allotment to at minimum an average of the benchmark 2374 Alamo Pintado Aveounties below:
