Update on State and Local Impacts – Year 1

Background

- The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act
- Passed November 4, 2014
- Reduces and modifies non-violent and nonserious felonies to misdemeanors
- Creates the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Fund
- Disbursement of funds to granting agencies in August of 2016

State Impacts

- Prisoner population to be 137.5% design capacity per SCOTUS, est. 113,720 inmates
- Realignment and Prop 47 have reduced population to 113,100
- ADP decline of 4,767 (9%), Prop 47 decline of 6,334 (50% of Prop 47 specific)
- Now the law but not yet the New Normal

State Fiscal Impacts

- FY 2015-16 is first year of estimated savings, deposit in SNSF by July 31, 2016
- Governor's budget proposal est. \$29.3M
- LAO estimates \$100M more in savings
- Prop 47 did not clearly define estimate formula or deposit mechanism
- Exact savings amount will not be known until State Budget is adopted

LAO Original Projections

- Freed up Jail beds and probation resources
 - Initial declines in ADP, 2016 levels rising
 - Probation decline in adult supervision
- Resentencing and reclassification workload increases, then taper off
 - March 2015 was peak of petitions
- Long term reduced criminal justice workload
 - Increased Misdemeanors, Felony decreases

Behavioral Wellness

- ADP upward trend in services provided
- Inpatient utilization remains exceedingly high

Courts

- Petitions continue to decline
- Treatment courts initial decline, beginning to increase

District Attorney

- Petitions declining, 1,750 in first year
- Failure to Appear (Misdemeanor Warrants) 42% increase
- Drug violations, Domestic Violence, and theft have been on the rise before and after Prop 47 implementation

Public Defender

- 1,600 Petitions in first year
- Felony filings have decreased, misdemeanor cases appointed have increased
- Community outreach could increase petitions

Probation

- Adult offenders under supervision has decreased
- Minimal impacts on Collaborative Courts

Sheriff

- Jail system is overcrowded
- Initial declines in ADP, recent increases returning to pre-Prop 47 levels.

Conclusion and Next Steps

- Conclusive statement on merits of Prop 47 is not available
- Local trends are not clearly causal
- Original expectations appear to be occurring, continue to monitor
- Next step is to apply for available grants

Recommendation

- a) Receive and file an update on impacts to departments of Proposition 47 – The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act; and
- b) Determine action is not a project subject to CEQA review
