### **Summary Text:**

The California Education Code, Section 8499.5, requires Child Care Planning Councils to determine priorities for state-funded child development programs by zip code. The priorities are determined by looking at the number of children eligible for subsidized care in three age groups: Infant & Toddler (aged birth to three years, Preschool (aged three to five years) and School-Age (ages six to 12 years). The priorities are submitted the California Department of Education, Early Education and Support Division annually to provide guidance on where the greatest needs for care are located in each county should there be new funding available. When there are no significant changes, the priorities require only the approval of the Planning Council Chair. However, this year, because the Council has completed the gathering of data required for updating its Needs Assessment for Early Care and Education, we are asking approval from the Board of Supervisors. William J. Cirone, County Superintendent of Schools, has indicated his approval of the funding priorities by signing Attachment B.

### **Background:**

Santa Barbara County's original Child Care Planning Council ("the Council") was formed by the Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools in 1990 as a result of the 1990 Federal Omnibus Budget Act. The role of the Council was to develop a local plan and priorities for distribution of the new Federal Child Care Block Grant funds. For its first few years, financial support for the Council's activities was provided entirely through in-kind services donated by the County Office of

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Education and Council members. Since 1994 the Council has received annual grants from the CA Department of Education, which are administered by the County Education Office.

Since the inception of the Council, members have worked to coordinate and plan the delivery of child care services in Santa Barbara County, serve as liaison between the CA Department of Education and the local community, and provide support and training to the local Early Childhood Education Community.

Pursuant to the Statutes of 1997, AB 1542, which established California's welfare reform program (CalWORKs), a local Child Care Planning Council must be established in each county. On April 28, 1998, your Board (in conjunction with the County Superintendent of Schools, which has joint authority over the Council) amended the functions, governance, structure, membership and bylaws of the existing Council to conform to the requirements of AB 1542 (Education Code, Sections 8499 – 8499.7).

### **Instructions for the LPC Priority Submittal**

Please submit your Local Child Care Planning Council Priorities using the following specifications:

- One Excel spreadsheet for General Child Care and Development Programs.
- One Excel spreadsheet for State Preschool Programs.
- All zip codes in a county cannot be listed as Priority 1.
- Only one LPC Priority per zip code.
- Use Microsoft Excel 2000 or newer version.

There are only three columns of information necessary on each excel spreadsheet.

- County Code: Please enter the two digit code for the county in question. For instance, Butte County is 04, Alameda is 01, and Fresno is 10. (text format) Please note that for county code numbers below 10 (i.e. Alameda, Butte, Contra Costa, etc.) you may not be able to type in both "0" and the "number" if the format is set to "Number". You may need to change the format for that column to "Text."
- 2. **Zip Code:** Please include only one zip code per LPC priority number. For example, 95661 is LPC priority 1 ONLY... Not both LPC priorities 1 and 2. (use text format).
- 3. **LPC Priority Ranking:** Please enter the corresponding LPC priority ranking next to the appropriate zip code. Remember, only one LPC priority per zip code.

Your county must choose one of three methods to submit priorities and it must be the same choice on both spreadsheets. The three methods are listed below:

- 1. All zip codes for the county are listed and given a corresponding LPC priority ranking of 1, 2, or 3.
- 2. Most zip codes for the county are listed and given a corresponding LPC priority ranking of 1 or all remaining (non-listed) zip codes are designated as LPC Priority 3.
- 3. Most zip codes for the county are listed and given a corresponding LPC priority ranking of 1, 2, or 3. All remaining (non-listed) zip codes are given **no priority** and will not be funded.
