Recommended Actions:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Community Action Commission of Santa Barbara County (CAC) in the amount not to exceed \$90,000.00, to provide Home Connection Finder (HCF) Services for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 (Attachment 1); and
- b) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Community Action Commission of Santa Barbara County (CAC) in the amount not to exceed \$98,000.00, to provide SafeCare Program Services for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 (Attachment 2); and
- c) Determine that the approvals and execution of the above Agreements are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that the approvals and execution of the Agreements are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.

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Summary Text:

These items are on the agenda as these contracts in aggregate will exceed the \$100,000 threshold in our department and in order to inform the Board of the total amount of funding allocated to CAC through the Department of Social Services (DSS) as of this date and to recommend that the Board:

- 1. Approve the Agreement with CAC to provide Home Connection Finder (HCF) Services; and
- 2. Approve the Agreement with CAC to provide SafeCare Program Services.

Background:

In previous fiscal years, these services were obtained through Purchasing Contracts that were renewed on an annual basis. Given the amount of funding to this service provider, all known contracts and purchase orders are now provided to the Board for approval.

These two (2) contracts are provided for your approval.

1. Home Connection Finder (HCF) Services

The purpose of this contract is to address the critical need for placements and/or locate a significant adult connection. The contractor will provide HCF staff to perform the duties of the HCF for Santa Barbara County. HCF services are available to children in either the Juvenile Dependency (dependent children) or the Juvenile Delinquency (wards) systems. CAC has been providing these services for the last four (4) years.

2. SafeCare Program Services

The purpose of this contract is to provide SafeCare Program Services, an evidence-based, parent-training curriculum, for parents who are at-risk or have been reported for child maltreatment. CAC has been providing these services for the last five (5) years.

DSS has had a positive and productive relationship with CAC.

Existing Board Contracts:

The Board approved the following Board Contract with CAC for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017:

• **CWS Enhanced Family Reunification** – during Budget Hearings via the Ongoing Contracts List for an amount not to exceed \$270,000.00.

The Board is scheduled to review the following Board Contracts with CAC for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017:

• **CWS - Front Porch** – amount not to exceed \$128,000.00.

Performance Measure:

These performance measures refer to the two proposed Agreements before the Board for consideration:

For Home Connection Finder Services:

- 95% of Home Connection Finder searches shall be initiated within 24 hours of receiving the referral.
- 80% of Home Connection Finder searches shall result in a possible significant adult connection for the child.
- 80% of Home Connection Finder searches shall result in a possible placement for the child.
- 80% of Home Connection Finder searches shall be completed within 60 days of receiving the referral.

For SafeCare Program Services:

- 100% of families opened to SafeCare® shall be contacted by a Home Visitor within 3 business days to schedule the first appointment.
- 85% of the families who remain enrolled in SafeCare® after the first home visit shall complete all training modules.
- 95% of parents who complete each module shall demonstrate improved skills and competence in child healthcare, parent/child interaction, and home safety as measured at baseline and after the completion of each of the three modules.

- 95% of families who complete SafeCare® shall not have a subsequent substantiated referral for abuse or neglect within 3 months.
- 100% of the Home Visitors shall continue to participate in coaching to ensure fidelity to the SafeCare® model.
