- a) Authorize the Public Works Director or his or her designee to submit an application to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery for any and all payment programs offered; and
- b) Authorize the Public Works Director or his or her designee to execute in the name of the County of Santa Barbara all documents necessary to secure payment and implement associated activities.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to approve the attached resolution. The proposed resolution will enable the Public Works Director or his or her designee to apply for, accept, and use funds from California Department of Resource Recycling and Recovery (aka CalRecycle) various programs rather than have to submit separate applications to receive grants, loans, or other payments from those programs.

Background:

CalRecycle offers various grant, loan, and payment programs to assist public and private entities in managing various types of waste. Historically, local governments have had to submit separate applications to receive grants, loans, or other payments from CalRecycle's various programs. Some of these programs also require that a local government have its governing body approve a resolution to authorize its staff to apply for, accept, and use these funds. Rather than having to submit separate applications for each program, a local government may now apply for, accept, and use funds from

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CalRecycle's various programs by having its governing body approve a resolution providing this authorization.

Fiscal Analysis:

Narrative:

The County receives annual payments from CalRecycle under the Recycling Market Development Zone Program, the Beverage Container Recycling City/County Payment Program, and the Used Oil Payment Program. The State allocates \$5,000 in Zone Incentive Funds to each Recycling Market Development Zone (RMDZ) annually. CalRecycle also provides funding to local governments for activities that encourage and promote recycling of beverage containers that are subject to the Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act. The County has historically received an average of \$36,000 annually from the Beverage Container Recycling programs.

In addition, through the Used Oil Payment Program, CalRecycle provides local governments funding for developing and maintaining used oil and used oil filter collection and recycling programs. Historically, the County has received \$57,000 under the Used Oil program. Revenue from these programs is currently included in the Resource Recovery & Waste Management Division budget for FY 16/17.
