Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreements for Services of Independent Contractor to assist with storm water regulation compliance for the period of August 23, 2016 through June 30, 2017 in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 with each of the following consultants:
 - i) Geosyntec Consultants (a local vendor)
 - ii) Wallace Group (a tri-county vendor)
 - iii) Larry Walker Associates Inc. (a tri-county vendor)
- b) Determine that the services contracts do not constitute a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Guidelines §15378 (b)(2)(continuing administrative or maintenance activities).

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to obtain Board of Supervisor's approval for Agreements for Services of Independent Contractor with three consulting firms currently assisting Project Clean Water staff with requirements of the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Permit program: 1) Geosyntec Consultants; 2) the Wallace Group; and 3) Larry Walker Associates Inc. For each of these Agreements for Services of Independent Contractors with Geosyntec Consultants, Wallace Group, and Larry Walker Associates for Stormwater Consulting Services, All Supervisorial Districts Agenda Date: August 23, 2016 Page 2 of 3

firms, the County's \$100,000 purchasing threshold per vendor will be exceeded when combined with existing contracts.

Following Board approval, Public Works will issue Notices to Proceed to each Contractor. In order to effectively direct activities and control costs, the Notices to Proceed will specify tasks, deliverables, and timelines associated with compliance activities for State and Federal storm water regulations. Each Notice to Proceed will be on an approved Scope of Work acceptable to Public Works and the Contractor. These agreements will be used for work on an as needed basis.

Background:

Pursuant to Federal Clean Water Act regulations implemented through the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit program, the County is responsible for the reduction and/or elimination of pollutants from the County's storm drain system to the Maximum Extent Practicable. This pollutant reduction standard requires the County to implement Best Management Practices (BMPs), including but not limited to education and outreach, source controls, inspection and monitoring, and storm water treatment for new and existing development/developed areas.

In order to efficiently and effectively reduce and/or eliminate the discharge of pollutants to waters of the U.S. the Maximum Extent Practical standards are continuously changing. As a result of this dynamic BMP development and implementation process, the County must continuously revise individual BMPs, and the storm water program as a whole, in order to satisfy the evolving standards. With the assistance of professional services provided by consultants, Project Clean Water staff strives for program effectiveness and efficiency through careful creation, implementation, evaluation, and revision of required BMPs.

Each of the three specified firms has been successfully providing consulting services to the County in addressing these evolving standards. Specific examples include: 1) Larry Walker Associates Inc., currently assisting the County with new State Water Resources Control Board requirements for eliminating trash from entering the storm drain system; 2) Geosyntec Consultants recently provided resources necessary for County compliance with Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (CCRWQCB) clarifications of the NPDES Permit involving the establishment of prescriptive BMP requirements for assessing and reducing pollutant loads using storm water modeling; and 3) the Wallace Group is assisting the County through the provision of engineering services necessary to develop a strategy for which demonstrates public and private development compliance with CCRWQCB Post-Construction Requirements (R3-2013-0032).

Each of these firms is currently on the approved consultants list, has local storm water experience, and has been evaluated and selected through the Master Services Agreement process by the Public Works Department. The Master Services Agreement process provides a rigorous competitive evaluation of consultant qualifications, and selected consultants are available for on-call services. However, the \$100,000 purchase threshold for countywide contracts precludes the continued use of these consultants' services without Board approval. The requested contracts for professional services will provide for continuation of their ongoing services through this fiscal year.
