Project Description: The Community Choice Energy (CCE) program is a Tri-County (Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo) effort led by Santa Barbara County that would have the potential to give customers a choice in their energy provider and is among over 20 consortiums of local agencies that are in the process of investigating or forming a CCE in California. Most prospective programs begin with a feasibility evaluation, which entails detailed load data analysis, and all prospective programs are required to complete necessary load data analysis in order to register a CCE implementation plan with the California Public Utility Commission (CPUC).


