Dear Ms. Zeitz:

I am pleased to inform you that the California Health Facilities Financing Authority ("the Authority") approved a final allocation to the County of Santa Barbara under the Investment in Mental Health Wellness Grant Program (the "Program") at its May 26, 2016 meeting. The final allocation is set forth in the attachment to this letter.

Please be advised that funding of this grant is conditioned upon the County of Santa Barbara meeting certain requirements as specified in the Program regulations, including signing a grant agreement and providing requested documentation acceptable to the Authority prior to disbursement of funds. The Authority reserves the right to modify or cancel the commitment of grant funds upon failure to execute a grant agreement or other failure to comply with the Program regulations. The Authority may also modify or cancel the grant award if the Authority becomes aware of any matter which, if known at the time of Application review and approval, would have resulted in the rejection of the Application or the grant not being approved. The Authority is not liable in any manner whatsoever should such funding not be completed for any reason whatsoever. The grant is subject to availability of funds.

The grant period begins on May 26, 2016 and ends December 31, 2017 unless the grant period is extended by the Authority. The County must be determined "feasible, sustainable, and ready" as per the Program regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Section 7119 (a)(4)) within nine months after May 26, 2016, which is February 27, 2017. A disbursement request form with accompanying documents as per California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Section 7125 must be received by the Authority a month before your resolution expiration date or you must submit a reasonable justification for an extension to be considered by the Authority board. Eligible costs are described in the Program regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Section 7115) and are limited to the project as further detailed in the grant agreement and attachment to this letter.

Yuanyuan Wei will serve as the grant officer to assist you throughout the grant period. The grant officer will be contacting you to discuss the next steps of the grant disbursement process, including the Authority's request for a resolution from your governing board authorizing the acceptance of the grant and all responsibilities flowing therefrom. ATTACHMENT

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proceeds of the grant will be used by the County of Santa Barbara as follows:

Crisis Residential Treatment Program

The County of Santa Barbara (the "County") will develop a new 6-bed Crisis Residential Treatment ("CRT") Program for adults who cope with co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse disorders. The CRT Program will offer a non-institutional, home-like setting for individuals experiencing mental health issues to receive up to 30 days of respite, peer support, and linkage to ongoing mental health services and resources. In this environment, supportive crisis intervention occurs to support one's individual effort towards recovery. The program proposed emphasizes a warm, comforting, home-like setting designed to reinforce the stabilization and recovery process. The CRT Program will operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week and is expected to provide services to accommodate approximately 150 consumers annually. Grant funds will be used for the purchase of real property, construction or renovation, the purchase of furnishings and equipment, and for information technology costs.
