Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Receive and file a presentation on the status of the re-design of the Probation Department's Alternative Report and Resource Center (ARRC); and
- B. Determine that the acceptance of the ARRC update is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that the activities are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activities in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.

Summary Text:

In June of this year, Santa Barbara County Probation began the redesigns of the ARRCs to increase total operating hours and attendance, enhance services in Lompoc, increase treatment services, and decrease the use of costly maximum security beds at the juvenile hall. The enhanced treatment model focuses on assessment, case planning, and service delivery rather than community service work. In August 2016, Lompoc implemented an ARRC, enhanced program services, and increased operating days from 3 to 5 days a week. In September 2016, the Santa Barbara ARRC enhanced services and increased operating

days from 3 to 5 days a week. Santa Maria ARRC anticipates enhanced services and increased operating days of 3 to 5 days in October 2016. This report provides an update on these activities.

Background:

On June 15, 2016 as part of the budget discussion, the Board of Supervisors authorized Probation to move forward with the implementation of an enhanced ARRC, which is a collaborative program that moves the ARRC from monitoring centers to enhanced treatment models. The primary goal of the redesigned program is to increase total operating hours and attendance, increase treatment services, decrease the use of costly maximum security beds at the juvenile hall, and enhance services in Lompoc. The enhanced treatment model focuses on assessment, case planning, and service delivery rather than community service work.

The enhanced ARRCs are anticipated to have increased operating days for all sites by October 11, 2016. As discussed at the June 2016 Budget Hearings, Probation is to provide an update to the Board on the status of the transition to this new model.

The plan for the new ARRC was presented to the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) on August 12, 2016 and was well received.

Lompoc

Lompoc ARRC began services on August 2, 2016. ARRC is now open Tuesday through Saturday with the following services being provided:

- Team meetings of agencies working with Probation youth such as Joven Nobles, a youth leadership
 development program that supports and guides male youth while focusing on the prevention of
 substance abuse, teen pregnancy, relationship violence, gang violence and school failure;
- Moral Reconation Therapy (MRT), which is therapy that helps change how youth see things, understand social situations, and respond to their own impulses, especially when faced with the possibility of wrongdoing;
- Tutoring:
- Seeking Safety, which is cognitive behavioral therapy that addresses trauma and addiction;
- Work And Gain Economic Self Sufficiency (WAGE\$\$), a youth employment program;
- Parent Information Nights, information on local resources for youth and their families;
- Drug and Alcohol Counseling;
- Individual/family counseling; and
- Weekend Commitment Alternative Program (WeCAP), counseling, and community service work.

The ARRC is staffed with a minimum of two adults: a Juvenile Institutions Officer and a full time Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) counselor from Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center.

Santa Barbara

Santa Barbara ARRC began services on September 13, 2016. ARRC is now open on Tuesday through Saturday with the following services being provided:

- Joven Nobles;
- MRT;
- Tutoring;
- WAGE\$\$;
- Parent Information Night (scheduled);
- Individual/family Counseling; and
- WeCAP.

ARRC is staffed by a Juvenile Institutions Officer. All youth requiring Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) services are currently being referred to CADA.

Santa Maria

Santa Maria ARRC is currently operating Friday through Sunday and is staffed by a Juvenile Institutions Officer. The Supervisor assigned to oversee the ARRC reports that enhanced services will begin on October 11, 2016 at which time ARRC will be open Tuesday through Saturday with the following services being provided:

- Joven Nobles;
- MRT;
- Tutoring;
- WAGE\$\$;
- Parent Information Nights;
- Individual/family counseling; and
- WeCAP.

All youth requiring Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) services are being referred to Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center and Santa Maria Youth and Family Center.

Behavior Wellness continues to recruit for licensed Marriage Family Therapist (MFT) or Licensed Clinical Worker (LCSW) with substance abuse treatment experience. The MFT or LCSW will ensure that the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) assessment on youth entering ARRC in all three geographical locations is completed. Currently, there is a Behavioral Wellness assessor that conducts CANS on detained youth. The Behavioral Wellness staff will be located at the probation facilities, one in the North County and one in the South County.

Performance Measure:

- Reduce juvenile hall bookings for probation violations related to alcohol and drug use by 25%.
- Increase county-wide average daily attendance from less than 10 to 30.
- Reduce return offenders to Los Prietos Boys' Camp by 5%.




