Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement with KRA Corporation, to provide One Stop Operator and Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Operator Services in Santa Barbara County (North County), for the period of November 15, 2016 through June 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$1,697,355.00 (FY 16/17 the contract amount shall not exceed \$339,471.00; for FY 17/18 the contract amount shall not exceed \$678,942.00; and for FY 18/19 the contract amount shall not exceed \$678,942.00) (Attachment 1); and
- b) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement with KRA Corporation, to provide One Stop Operator and Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Operator Services in Santa Barbara County (South County), for the period of November 15, 2016 through June 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$1,262,195.00 (FY 16/17 the contract amount shall not exceed \$252,439.00; for FY 17/18 the contract amount shall not exceed \$504,878.00; and for FY 18/19 the contract amount shall not exceed \$504,878.00) (Attachment 2); and
- c) Determine that the approval and execution of the Agreements are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that the execution of the Agreements are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to

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projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order approve the Agreements with KRA Corporation to provide One Stop Operator and Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Operator Services in Santa Barbara County.

It is the recommendation of DSS to authorize and execute these Agreements with KRA Corporation.

Background:

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) was signed into law on July 22, 2014. It repeals the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 and replaces it with new authorization language that is in effect from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2020.

In accordance with the WIOA, the County Executive Office (CEO) released a Request for Proposal (RFP) on April 15, 2016 to identify qualified service provider(s) for the One Stop Operator and Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Operator in Santa Barbara County. The California Workforce Association (CWA) provided technical support and guidance to the CEO throughout the procurement process. CEO issued a press release and posted the RFP online. As a result, four (4) proposals were received for the South County competition and three (3) proposals were received for the North County competition by the submittal due date of May 27, 2016.

Following a comprehensive evaluation, an Evaluation Panel made up of workforce practitioners and experts from across the State, recommended awarding both North and South County contracts to KRA Corporation. At its July 15, 2016 meeting the WDB, after a presentation by the CEO and CWA, voted to accept the Evaluation Panel's recommendation and directed staff to negotiate Agreements with KRA. In accordance with the roles and responsibilities outlined in the Federal WIOA, the negotiated Agreements are now presented to the BOS, acting as the WIOA-designated Chief Local Elected Official, for execution.

Finally, it should be noted that KRA is recognized as a national leader in workforce development for its innovative solutions, exceptional service, and trusted results. Since 1981, KRA Corporation has supported the mission of federal, regional, state, and local agencies that are dedicated to improving the lives of individuals and strengthening communities.

Narrative:

The County will fund the Agreements with KRA Corporation using \$2,959,550.00 of U.S. Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration (DOLETA) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Adult and Dislocated Worker Formula funds. The Department is requesting approval and

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authorization to execute Agreements in FY 2016-17 of \$591,910.00 for Services and Supplies to provide workforce-related services and support to youth in Santa Barbara County.

The Department will include appropriations of \$1,183,820.00 for the Agreements for Services and Supplies in the Department's FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 recommended budgets. There is no impact to the General Fund.

Key Contract Risks:

The Contract Risk Assessment worksheet has been completed. DSS has determined that KRA Corporation is a higher risk vendor as this is a large contract with a term of three years. KRA is a new vendor for the County with significant experience as One Stop provider in other Counties. The risk will be mitigated with performance monitoring conducted on a quarterly, or as needed basis. KRA Corporation is insured for General and Professional Liability.
