




Sandyland Seawall Background



Sandyland Seawall History

- Original Seawall was constructed in 1964
 - Homeowners financed
 - County given an easement
 - Public Works constructed
- Emergency repairs in 1980, 1983, 1994, 1998
 - Homeowners financed
 - Public Works constructed repairs
- 1983: Emergency repairs and expansion




Sandyland Seawall History






Sandyland Seawall History: 1964 wall



Sandyland Seawall History: 1983 Repairs

- Increased size of revetment
- Added splash zone and splash wall
- Extended the wall south
 - Homeowners financed



Sandyland Seawall Recent History

- 2002: Homeowners association (HOA) requests repairs
- 2004: Assessment collected for repair design
- 2006: HOA requests County proceed with repairs
- 6/19/2007: BOS approves repairs
- 2008-2010: Coastal Commission and State Lands issues
- 2012: Assessment refunded to HOA to work on State Lands
- 2016: Coastal Commission Notice of Violation
- 2016: HOA requests new study and assessment

Sandyland Seawall Assessment Scope

THIS ASSESSMENT:

- Develop alternatives for seawall repair
- Complete project environmental documents
- Complete Coastal Development Permit

FUTURE WORK:

State Lands

Sandyland Seawall Assessment Procedures

- Each homeowner has received a ballot for the assessment
- The amount of the assessment for each homeowner is based upon the linear footage of seawall on their property
- The assessment is successful if a weighted majority of those casting ballots are in favor of the assessment
- Proposed assessment:
 - >\$351,000 Engineering Studies and Design
 - >\$350,000 Environmental and Permitting
 - >\$50,000 Fees
- Any unused amount may be used for construction or State Lands phases



Sandyland Seawall Recommendations - vote passes

- a) Consider recommendations regarding the Sandyland Seawall Maintenance District Number 1 Proposed Benefit Assessment for Rock Revetment Repair in Fiscal Year 2017-18;
- b) Receive oral and written testimony and written protests that have been filed, if any;
- c) Tabulate written property owner ballots;
- d) Adopt, at the conclusion of the public hearing, the attached Resolution entitled "Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara, State of California Imposing a 2017-18 Benefit Assessment within Sandyland Seawall Maintenance District No. 1", if there is not a "majority protest" as defined in this Board Letter;
- e) Approve and file, upon approval of the assessment, the attached Report entitled "Engineer's Report on Proposed 2017-18 Assessment for engineering, environmental, and permitting work for Sand Point Road Rock Revetment Repair" with the Clerk of the Board.
