### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair of the Board to execute a Memorandum of Understanding Agreement between the Bunnies Urgently Needing Shelter organization and Santa Barbara County (Attachment A) that annually renews after an initial period through June 30, 2017.
- b) Approve and authorize the Chair of the Board to execute a License Agreement between the Bunnies Urgently Needing Shelter organization and Santa Barbara County (Attachment B) for the use of a portion of the Animal Shelter facility in Goleta, for a period of 5 years; and
- c) Determine that these activities are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act review per CEQA Guideline Section 15061(b)(3), since it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activities may have a significant effect on the environment, and direct staff to file the Notice of Exemption (Attachment C).

#### Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to consider the approval and execution of a Memorandum of Understanding and a License Agreement between a long time non-profit partner and County Animal Services. The MOU and License Agreement for approval today are with the Bunnies Urgently Needing Shelter (BUNS) organization. These documents serve to clarify the relationship between the organization and County Animal Services.

### **Background:**

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County Animal Services has been fortunate to have the support of non-profit partners that work with the department to provide care, enrichment, medical procedures, capital improvements, adoption counseling, lost and found services and various other services and supplies to establish and maintain a safe and healthy environment between humans and animals in Santa Barbara County.

The American Humane Association Program Assessment made recommendations that were specific to making the relationships between County Animal Services and the internal partners more formal. These recommendations were:

12.1A Configure structured relationships with internal partners. Work to create unified command structure. Establish and follow a clear chain of command.

12.1C Develop specific MOU's with internal partners that include and define accountability and supervision.

This is the second of four MOU agreements that are being developed with internal partner organizations. In addition to developing the MOU Agreement, the department worked with the Real Property Division of General Services to generate a license agreement for BUNS' use of a portion of the Animal Shelter Facility located at 5473 Overpass Road, in Goleta, which is designated as the "Rabbit Area."

This agreement memorializes BUNS long-standing practice of providing rabbit and guinea pig care on County property at the Goleta Animal Shelter, using its own funds as necessary, with a goal of avoiding euthanasia of any of these animals. The agreement spells out who provides what supplies, lists areas of mutual decision-making as it relates to individual animals, clarifies the County's legal custody of all these animals, and introduces a code of conduct and insurance requirements for BUNS volunteers as well as the obligation that BUNS provides liability insurance for its operations at the Shelter.

Negotiations and discussions are ongoing with the other two internal partner organizations for their individual MOUs. Additional agreements with the Companion Animal Placement Assistance (CAPA) and the Animal Shelter Assistance Program (ASAP) organizations will be recommended to the Board of Supervisors when they are completed and have had final County staff review.

# Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The License Agreement grants BUNS the use of the portion of the Goleta Animal Shelter which is designated as the "Rabbit Area" for the purpose of providing shelter, veterinary care, behavioral support, adoption and foster services, education and community outreach services for stray, protective custody, and homeless rabbits and guinea pigs in Santa Barbara County.

### Budgeted: No

### Fiscal Analysis:

Approving and authorizing the BUNS Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and License Agreement between BUNS and Santa Barbara County, increases services and supplies costs by an estimated \$3,000, since the MOU includes a \$25 reimbursement to BUNS when rabbits are adopted that have had spay or

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neuter surgery paid for by BUNS. These costs to BUNS are approximately \$200 to \$300 per rabbit, and BUNS agrees to continue covering these costs as written in the MOU at an annual estimated cost of \$24,000-\$36,000. Acceptance of the MOU and License Agreement does not affect mandates or service levels.
