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Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve and execute the attached contract with VTC Enterprises to provide meals at the Santa Maria Juvenile Hall (SMJH) for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020, not to exceed amount of \$1,047,093.75.
- B. Determine that the approval of the Agreement is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(4), finding that this activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (Attachment B).

Summary Text:

VTC has provided dinner meals to the SMJH since FY 2007-08 and added lunch meal services in December 2015 under the current bid.

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Background:

The SMJH has a board rated capacity of 140 youth and is responsible for the health and welfare of youth detained there, including the provision of meals. Over the first six months of this current fiscal year the average daily population was 65 youth, with a high population of 75 and low of 55. Breakfasts are prepared by Food Services Workers employed by the Probation Department and lunch and dinner meals are prepared by the contracted vendor.

The attached contract insures that the Probation Department only pays for those meals ordered on a daily basis by SMJH staff. It allows for a minimum number of 50 meals and a maximum of 125 meals per day through an efficient tiered pricing model. The tiered system allows the County to benefit from current population trends in the SMJH while accommodating the potential reduction in the number of youths housed in the SMJH.

Assenbly Bill 10 was passed in 2013 and incrementally increased the state minimum wage by \$.50 on January 1, 2017 and by \$1.00 each subsequent new year until it reaches a maximum of \$15.00 per hour. This multi-year contract includes no increase for the first year and 5% increases each of the next two years to accommodate the minimum wage increases.

Performance Measure:

The dinner and lunch meals, in combination with the breakfast meal, shall not exceed the daily minimum caloric and nutrition standards set forth by the Title 15 of the California Code of Regulations, Article 9, Minimum Standards for Juvenile Facilities, Section 1461. Meals are to contain no more than 30% of calories from total fat and 10% of calories from saturated fat.

Additionally, contractor must maintain menu, food production and temperature records which demonstrate that the required food components, food items, or menu items are served each given day.

Meals shall be delivered to the location and at the times specified in the contract.
