The applicant is proposing to stabilize an eroded slope and rebuild an existing driveway that was partially destroyed in a mud slide caused by a recent storm. The driveway was designed with a drainage culvert to route storm water below the driveway. The drainage culvert failed and a portion of the driveway washed away. The applicant will remove the failed drainage culvert, re-grade the slope to closely match the previous grade and replace the failed culvert with a redesigned culvert to route water through the existing drainage basin. Riprap will be placed down-gradient of the culvert to dissipate storm water energy and reduce the potential for scour during storm events. The soil will be seeded with native plants and storm water best management practices used where necessary to prevent erosion.
