## Reasons to support exemption findings:

CEQA does not apply to the establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, or approval of rates, tolls, fares, or other charges by public agencies which the public agency finds are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, purchasing or leasing of supplies, equipment or material, meeting financial reserves needs and requirements or obtaining funds for capital projects, necessary to maintain service within existing service areas. The proposed project provides for the establishment of rates for fiscal year 2017-18 to ensure that the appropriate reserve will be established prior to the County beginning to pay the projected debt services for the Resource Recovery Project. A Subsequent EIR for the Resource Recovery Project was certified by the Board of Supervisors in July 2016. If the project is not constructed, the reserve will be used to design an alternative system to maintain existing services levels of solid waste collection and for disposal at County facilities to meet the region's solid waste management needs to compliance with current and future state and federal waste-related regulations. Any capital project identified from the design analysis supported by the reserve would be subject to separate CEQA review.
