RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING JUNE 2, 2017 AS WEAR ORANGE DAY IN SANTA BARBARA COUNTY IN RECOGNITION OF NATIONAL GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS, gun violence is the cause of over 33,000 deaths annually in the United States, which includes homicides, suicides, accidents and other causes; and

WHEREAS, June 2 is recognized as Gun Violence Awareness Day across the United States and citizens are encouraged to wear orange to support common sense solutions that will save lives; and

WHEREAS, the Wear Orange campaign was started by high school students from the Southside of Chicago to commemorate the loss of their fifteen-year old friend and classmate, Hadiya Pendleton, who was shot and killed just one week after performing at President Obama's 2nd inaugural parade in 2013. After her death, they asked us to stand up, speak out, and Wear Orange to raise awareness about gun violence. They chose the color orange because it is the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others; and

WHEREAS, the communities of Isla Vista, Santa Barbara and our nation continue to grieve from the mass shooting three years ago on May 23, 2014, killing six people and injuring thirteen others;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED that this Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim June 2, 2017 as "Wear Orange Day in Santa Barbara County" and encourages all residents to remember the victims of gun violence by participating in scheduled community events.
