#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment with Pathway Family Services (Pathway), a local vendor, in the amount not to exceed \$56,000 for the period of January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, and \$80,000 for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, for the provision of Permanency Assessment Services (Attachment 1); and
- b) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment with Seneca Family of Agencies (Seneca), a local vendor, to provide Permanency Assessment Services for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 (Attachment 2); and
- c) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment with Family Care Network, Inc. (FCNI), a local vendor, to provide Permanency Assessment Services for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 (Attachment 3); and
- d) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment with Aspiranet, a local vendor, to provide Permanency Assessment Services for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 (Attachment 4); and

e) Determine that the approvals and execution of the above Amendments are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that the approvals and execution of the Amendments are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.

#### Summary Text:

Department of Social Services (DSS) is seeking approval of the First Amendments with Pathway, Seneca, FCNI, and Aspiranet to provide ongoing Permanency Assessment Services. It is the recommendation of DSS to authorize and execute the Amendments with each vendor.

### **Background:**

Due to the County's demographic composition, DSS has an increased need for permanency assessments to be completed in English or Spanish for matched and unmatched families engaged in the Resource Family Approval process. The utilization of these agreements will continue to aid in timely permanency for the County's dependent youth.

On December 13, 2016, the Board approved the initial Agreements with Pathway, Seneca, FCNI and Aspiranet to provide Permanency Assessment Services. During the current fiscal year, Pathway had an increased number of assessments and is requesting approval for the First Amendment for FY 2016/2017 to increase the current contract amount. Additionally, DSS is requesting approval for the First Amendments with Pathway, Seneca, FCNI, and Aspiranet to renew services for FY 2017/2018.

#### Performance Measure:

Pathway, Seneca, FCNI and Aspiranet are current providers of these services and have demonstrated substantial conformity with the identified performance measures as indicated below:

#### Current Performance Data (As of FY 2016/2017)

- Contractors will make contact with applicants within ten work days of receipt of referral 98% of the time. (In compliance)
- With family cooperation, Contractors will complete permanency assessments within 60 days of receiving a referral from the County 90% of the time. (In compliance)
- Contractors will provide monthly client update reports and monthly invoices to the County by the 15th of the month following the provision of services. (In compliance)

- Contractor will make contact with applicants within ten (10) work days of receipt of referral 98% of the time.
