PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Public Works Department requests the Board of Supervisors authorize the Purchasing Agent to waive competition for procuring traffic signal and lighting equipment for maintenance, emergency repairs, and new construction projects. Traffic signals and lighting are an integral part of the County's public transportation system that must operate properly at all times for the safety of the traveling public. The Public Works Department needs to be able to respond to traffic signal issues in a timely manner.

Reasons to support exemption findings (attach additional material, if necessary):

The Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors is the responsible agency to allow the County to utilize County Code Section 2-39 to authorize the purchasing agent to waive competition when there are limitations on the source of supply, necessary restriction in specifications, or other valid reasons after approval by the Board of Supervisors. Public Works requests the Board's approval for the waiver for traffic signal lighting components and supplies, as the prices of these items historically have exceeded the amount at which the Purchasing Agent can waive bidding without additional Board approval. The waiver of bids provides the Public Works Department the ability to expedite equipment purchases from all traffic signal vendors, without the current \$25,000 limit. The Department purchases equipment from vendors in California and nationally. There are no local vendors of these products. The term project refers to the general policy making activity which is being approved and which may be subject to several discretionary approvals by governmental agencies. The term project does not mean each separate governmental approval. Further, the request to adopt a Resolution will not create any unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect.
