Dear Honorable Supervisors:

Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck represents the applicants for the Rancho La Laguna project and, on their behalf, we hereby object to the setting of this hearing on July 11, 2017 for the following reasons:

- 1. One of the two applicants is unable to attend a hearing in Santa Barbara on that date.
- 2. This is a North County item and the applicants are entitled to a Santa Maria hearing, which they request.
- 3. The applicants have requested an August 29 hearing date, which is convenient for them and which will occur in Santa Maria, which is easier for them to reach.
- 4. The time limit for setting this hearing was established by the Legislature for the benefit of applicants to avoid long delays in the completion of a subdivision process. It was not intended to inconvenience applicants or deprive them of the opportunity to be present.
