Summary Text:

On June 15, 2017, the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury published a report entitled "Youth Safety in Santa Maria, Developing a New Strategy". Today, the Board will consider the proposed response to the report,

adopt their preferred response and authorize the Board Chair to sign the response letter. The Board is required to respond in writing to the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court by September 13, 2017.

Background:

On June 15, 2017, The Santa Barbara County Grand Jury (Grand Jury) published a report entitled "Youth Safety in Santa Maria, Developing a New Strategy". The Grand Jury concluded: "The Jury concludes that a successful Santa Maria Youth Task Force should reach out to surrounding area communities and their agencies. This model program would then actualize Santa Barbara County's original intention of having a task force serving all the youth of the North County".

The Santa Barbara County Grand Jury also commended the 5th District Supervisor, the City of Santa Maria and its Mayor for accepting the challenge of addressing the need to prevent, intervene and suppress the existing gang culture. The Jury "implores the City leaders to honor the rich diversity of their community by including the voices of all stakeholders, particularly parents and at-risk youth, during the planning process".

The Board of Supervisors is named as a responder to Findings 3 and 5, as well as Recommendations 3 and 5. The City of Santa Maria is named as a responder to Findings 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 as well as Recommendations 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

Staff anticipates no fiscal or facilities impacts as a result of the Board's action on this matter.
