- b) Authorize the Chair to sign the letter included in Attachment A and forward the letter and responses to the Presiding Judge of Santa Barbara County Superior Court; and
- c) Determine pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15378(b)(5) that the above actions are not a project subject to CEQA review, because it is a government administrative activity that does not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment.

Summary Text:

On June 19, 2017, the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury published a report entitled "Public Safety Radio Coverage, Is Our Safety At Risk". Today, the Board will consider the proposed response to the report, adopt their preferred response and authorize the Board Chair to sign the response letter. The Board is required to respond in writing to the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court by September 17, 2017.

Background:

On June 19, 2017, the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury published a report entitled "Public Safety Radio Coverage, Is Our Safety At Risk". The Grand Jury concluded: "Reliable radio reception for public safety agencies has been problematic in select areas of Santa Barbara County. The 2016-17 Santa Barbara County Grand Jury spoke with many law enforcement officers who recounted situations in which their work was hampered by poor reception, or no reception. Their safety and the public's safety are at risk. Santa Barbara County is in the process of putting up towers to increase coverage and eliminate dead spots in radio reception. The Jury recommends this be completed as soon as possible."

The Board of Supervisors is named as a responder to Findings 3 and 4, as well as Recommendations 3 and 4. The Sheriff is named as a responder to Findings 1, 2 and 3 as well as Recommendations 1, 2 and 3.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

Staff anticipates no fiscal or facilities impacts as a result of the Board's action on this matter.
