

Federal Accomplishments



Accomplishments

- Payment In Lieu of Taxes (PILT) program provided Santa Barbara County with \$1.86 million in PILT funding, a 2% increase over last year.
- Supported S.178, the Elder Abuse Prevention and Prosecution Act
- Worked with NACo to reauthorize the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
- Advocated in support of Federal resources through the annual appropriations process for pest detection and management activities, food and safety inspection, and specialty crop pests.



State Accomplishments



Accomplishments

- Sponsored and secured the Governor's signature on AB 566 (Limon)which will increase the fines on professionally organized special events that are held on private property for violations of local zoning and permitting codes. Previous fine limits were so low they provided no disincentive from skipping needed permits.
- Opposed AB 653 (Ridley-Thomas) that would have allowed property held in fee by a federally recognized tribe to become exempt from property taxes
- Along with CSAC and the Fix Our Roads Coalition, Santa Barbara County successfully advocated for SB 1 which will provide an additional \$5.2 billion for road repairs and mass transit by adjusting the State gas tax and reform other transportation fee structures so that all motorists contribute their share to road maintenance.
- Opposed enactment of AB 649 (Hueso) which would have eliminated discretionary review of the installation of small telecommunication cells throughout the community. This bill was opposed by a broad coalition of cities and counties.



State Accomplishments






- Successfully opposed AB 1250 (Jones-Sawyer) which would have subjected the County to significant administrative hurdles by requiring all new, existing and renewed contracts to meet significant new data collection and financial analysis requirements.
- Successfully opposed, unless amended, legislation that would have created a
 freeze on the formation of any new Community Choice Aggregation (CCA)
 organizations or restrict the expansion of the existing Community Choice
 Energy (CCE) programs prior to the Board of Supervisor's ability to consider
 any possible local program.
- Supported AB 114, a Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) trailer bill that preserved local funding. The bill was signed into law by the Governor in July 2017.
- Supported SB 44 (Jackson) that increased funding from tideland oil revenues for reducing and eliminating coastal hazards and the removal or remediation of legacy oil and gas wells. The bill received unanimous support in the Assembly on its way to the Governor's signature in October.
