#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve and authorize the Cahir to execute the attached Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with W. Haywood Burns Institute (BI) to provide technical assistance for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2017-2018, not to exceed amount of \$30,600.00; and
- B. Determine that the approval of the Agreement is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(4), finding that this activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (Attachment B).

#### **Summary Text:**

W. Haywood Burns Institute (BI) has been providing technical assistance concerning the Reducing Racial and Ethnic Disparity (R.E.D.) grant to the Probation Department since 2014. Anticipated activities for FFY 2017-2018 will include consultation with the Probation regarding the Juvenile Hall

Intake Assessment (JHIA) tool, the Incentive and Response Matrix, and the development of customized data reports that will be used by the Probation Department to monitor on-going R.E.D. grant efforts.

#### **Background:**

Probation initially received the R.E.D. grant in 2014 for phase one (1) of the Department's efforts to address racial disparity within the juvenile justice system in Santa Barbara County. Through a non-competitive application process, phase two (2) funding was received in 2015, phase three (3) funding was received in 2016 and phase four (4) funding for FFY 2017-2018 was received in September 2017. BI has provided technical assistance since the inception of the grant.

Racial and ethnic disparity refers to the unequal treatment of youth of color in the juvenile justice system; racial and ethnic disparity results in unequal outcomes for youth who are otherwise comparably situated. BI utilizes a data-driven process during a two (2) to three (3) year consultation period to identify strategic efforts in reducing disparity. BI has provided consultation in 90 jurisdictions across the country to date and has helped these jurisdictions to identify and address racial and ethnic disparity.

Local data analysis of arrests, referrals and bookings into juvenile hall revealed that youth of color were disprotionally represented in the juvenile justice system. As a result, BI has been working with the Probation Department to develop a juvenile hall assessement tool that is racially neutral. Additionally, data analysis indicated that a high volume of violations of probation were the primary driver for bookings into juvenile hall. BI has assisted the Probation Department with the development of a Response Matrix which will assist officers with appropriate alternatives to incarceration when a violation occurs.

The goals for phase four (4) of the R.E.D. grant are to field test the JHIA tool (including data collection and analysis), develop customized data reports, provide training to juvenile justice stakeholders, and plan for the sustainability of the R.E.D. efforts once the final year of the grant is completed.

#### **Performance Measure:**

- 1. Participate in four (4) onsite R.E.D. committee meetings; and participate in monthly conference calls in preparation of the monthly R.E.D. meetings.
- 2. Assist in the development of a User's Guide for the revised JHIA tool by March 1, 2018.
- 3. Assist in the analysis of aggregate data during the field testing of the JHIA by September 30, 2018.
- 4. Assist in the development of customized data reports to identify and monitor R.E.D. efforts by September 30, 2018.
