Recommended Actions:

- a) Approve and authorize the Public Works Director or his designee to execute amendments increasing the contract amount by \$500,000 to an amount of not-to-exceed of \$800,000 for trucking services with the following contractors:
 - i. Bob's Backhoe & Trucking (a local vendor)
 - ii. RLF Trucking & Grading Corp (a local vendor)
- b) Approve and authorize the Public Works Director or his designee to execute amendments increasing the contract amount by \$500,000 to a not-to-exceed of \$850,000 for on-call maintenance and protection services with the following contractors:
 - i) Bob's Backhoe & Trucking (a local vendor)
 - ii) Lash Construction, Inc. (a local vendor)
 - iii) Granite Construction, Inc. (a local vendor)
- c) Find that the recommended actions to amend contracts for trucking and maintenance services are fiscal activities not constituting a "Project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act, as set forth in 14 CCR 15378(b)(4).

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to authorize the Public Works Director or designee to execute amendments for the above listed trucking and on-call maintenance service agreements.

Trucking services are bid out every two years to provide trucking for routine maintenance and for emergency response work. The trucking contracts were awarded to the three low bidders and these amendments are with the two lowest bidders. All work is provided at an hourly rate and on an asneeded basis. These agreements are valid until June 30, 2019.

Every year, the District renews contracts with a variety of tri-county contractors pursuant to Public Contract Code 21271. The Flood Control District's Board of Directors can enter into contracts without advertising for bids if the work consists of protection or maintenance of channels, stormdrains, dams, or other flood control works and if the work is provided by day labor (time and material). Construction projects that require plans and specification will continue to follow the bidding procedure as required by the Public Contract Code. These annual agreements are approved as part of the budget as ongoing contracts. The work currently being performed as part of these agreements is emergency response and may be subject to State and Federal reimbursement.

Inviting proposals for services beyond the initially authorized amount is not feasible due to the current public exigency and emergency debris removal activities in floodways, streams, and debris basins, which will not permit a delay for further competitive solicitations. Authorizing the Public Works Director or designee to execute these amendments is recommended by the District to allow emergency work to continue.

Background:

The District has on-call maintenance, trucking, and crane service agreements in place for routine maintenance but more importantly in anticipation of emergency response efforts. In addition, the rates for these services are set in the agreements.

Narrative:

Current costs associated with the response events from the Thomas Debris Flow are being paid out of the South Coast Flood Zone, using current appropriations. A Budget Request Revision will be coming before your Board for approval addressing costs and anticipated expenditures that will be incurred by Flood Control. Appropriations will be increased using Flood Control reserves. These costs will also be submitted to the State and Federal agencies for reimbursements. These amendment amounts are being set higher than we anticipate for the Thomas Debris Flow response efforts to retain the ability to respond to additional events that may occur this winter.

The key contracts risks are low for these agreements.
