Coastal Zone portion not in effect until certified by the California Coastal Commission

Principal Suggested Modifications of Concern

- Article II Suggested Modifications
 - Permit Requirements for Certain Types of Agricultural Development
 - Permit Requirements for Certain Residential Accessory Structures
- Policy NS-4: Environmentally Sensitive Habitat (ESH) Criteria & Habitat Types
- Policy LU-13: Bluff-Top Development
- Policy REC-8: Prescriptive Rights modification

Article II Permit Requirements Certain Agricultural Development

- County Practice All Ag Exempt
- CC Staff Suggested Modifications
 - New Cultivation or Grazing – CDP
 - Cultivation or Grazing on Land Cultivated or Grazed Previous 10 years – Exempt

- County Request Exempt New If:
 - **•** Not on slopes $\geq 30\%$
 - **Grading** \leq 50 cu yd
 - Not within 100 ft stream, ESH
 - No removal of protected trees
 - Approved by CC in 2010

Article II Permit Requirements Certain Residential Accessory Structures

CC Staff Suggested Modifications

- Principal Permitted Use
 - CDP no hearing, not appealable to CC
- Non-Principal Permitted Use
 - CDP with hearing, appealable to CC
- One-Family Dwelling on AG-II Principal Permitted Use
- Residential Accessory Structures Non-Principal Permitted Use
- County Request
 - Allow as Principal Permitted Use

Policy NS-4 Environmentally Sensitive Habitat

- Criteria to Determine ESH
- Lists Habitats that Meet Criteria & Identifies as ESH
- County Adopted "Rare" Types of Chaparral
 - Pursuant to State Rarity Rankings
- CC Staff Suggested Modifications
 - Remove "Rare" such that all chaparral types would be considered ESH
- County Request
 - Restore "Rare" to Policy NS-4 for chaparral

Land Use Policy LU-13 Bluff-Top Development

- CC Staff Suggested Modifications
 - New Policy LU-13
 - Includes coastal bluff-top setback to consider 100 years bluff erosion
- Other CC Published Guidance
 - Consider 75 to 100 years bluff erosion
 - Defer to local jurisdiction for appropriate timeframe
- County Request
 - Delete erosion rate and defer to Coastal Resiliency LCP Amendment for countywide standard

Policy REC-8 – Protection of Coastal Access Prescriptive Rights

CC Staff Suggested Modifications

- If substantial evidence that implied dedication or prescriptive rights may exist
 - County would protect the public access area through public acquisition or permit conditions for new development
- County does not have authority to recognize unajudicated prescriptive rights
- County Request
 - Delete prescriptive rights suggested modification from Policy REC-8
