

# NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Based on a preliminary review of the project the following activity is determined to be exempt from further environmental review requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, as defined in the State and County Guidelines for the implementation of CEQA.

**PROJECT TITLE:** State of California 2017/18 Exchange and State Match Program, Agreement for the Exchange of Federal Highway Dollars.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Approve and Authorize the Chair of the Board to execute the agreement with the State of California, Department of Transportation, for the exchange of Federal Highway dollars for Non-Federal State Highway Account dollars, for Fiscal Year 2017/2018 apportionments in the amount of \$558,115. Each year, the County of Santa Barbara has the opportunity to exchange Federal Highway dollars for Non-Federal State Highway Account dollars through this agreement between the State and the County. This exchange is desirable as it gives the County the flexibility to use these funds for a wide range of transportation projects, from local road improvements to matching funds for other State or Federally funded projects. The Federal mandates associated with Federal funds are not applicable to funds converted to State Highway Account dollars; therefore, the only applicable federal restrictions are those specifically incorporated into the Agreement.

**Reasons to support exemption findings** (attach additional material, if necessary):

The Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors is the responsible agency to transfer funds for transportation projects in all Supervisorial Districts. The County of Santa Barbara has the opportunity to exchange Federal Highway dollars for Non-Federal State Highway Account dollars through an agreement between the State and the County. This exchange gives the County the flexibility to use these funds for a wide range of transportation projects. The Federal mandates associated with Federal funds are not applicable to funds converted to State Highway Account dollars; therefore, these funds can be used without Federal restrictions. The re-allocation of funding is not a project by definition. The term project refers to the activity which is being approved and which may be subject to several discretionary approvals by governmental agencies. The term project does not mean each separate governmental approval. The transfer of funds will not result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.
