Consider recommendations regarding Behavioral Wellness Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018 Alcohol and Drug Program contract increases and Budget Revision Request, as follows: (4/5 Vote Required)

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Aegis Treatment Centers, LLC (a local vendor), for the provision of narcotic treatment services, to increase the FYs 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 contract amounts by \$420,000.00 each year for a new total Contract amount not to exceed \$12,540,000.00 through June 30, 2019;
- b) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Coast Valley Worship Center DBA Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center (a local vendor), for the provisions of substance use disorder services, to increase the contract by \$111,500.00 for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$1,202,840.00 through June 30, 2018;
- c) Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with LAGS Spine and Sportscare Medical Centers, Inc. (a local vendor) for the provision of substance use disorder services, for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$122,500.00 for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, inclusive of \$100,000.00 under Purchase Order CN21146 but which otherwise cancels, nullifies, and supersedes Purchase Order CN21146;
- d) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a Third Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara Inc. (a local vendor), for the provision of substance abuse use disorder services for dually diagnosed adults, to increase the FYs 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 contract amounts by \$83,400.00 each year, for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$1,085,170.00 through June 30, 2019;
- e) Approve a Budget Revision Request No. 0005494 increasing appropriations of \$480,508.00 in the Behavioral Wellness Department, Alcohol and Drug Prógrams Fund for Services and Supplies funded by unanticipated revenue from Drug Medi-Cal, State Aid-Drug Medi-Cal, and 2011 Realignment revenue; and
- f) Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities or funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially physical impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

- A. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Aegis Treatment Centers, LLC (a local vendor), for the provision of narcotic treatment services, to increase the FYs 17-18 and 18-19 contract amounts by \$420,000 each year for a new total Contract amount not to exceed \$12,540,000 through June 30, 2019.
- B. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Coast Valley Worship Center DBA Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center (a local vendor), for the provisions of substance use disorder services, to increase the contract by \$111,500 for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$1,202,840 through June 30, 2018.
- C. Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with LAGS Spine and Sportscare Medical Centers, Inc. (a local vendor) for the provision of substance use disorder services, for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$122,500 for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, inclusive of \$100,000 under

Purchase Order CN21146 but which otherwise cancels, nullifies, and supersedes Purchase Order CN21146.

- D. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a Third Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with **Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara Inc.** (a local vendor), for the provision of substance abuse use disorder services for dually diagnosed adults, to increase the FYs 17-18 and 18-19 contract amounts by \$83,400 each year, for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$1,085,170 through June 30, 2019.
- E. Approve a Budget Revision Request (BRR#0005494) increasing appropriations of \$480,508 in the Behavioral Wellness Department, Alcohol and Drug Programs Fund for Services and Supplies funded by unanticipated revenue from Drug Medi-Cal, State Aid-Drug Medi-Cal, and 2011 Realignment revenue.
- F. Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities or funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially physical impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

Summary Text:

The above referenced contracts are on the agenda to request approval to increase both Drug and Non-Drug Medi-Cal funds due to unanticipated increased service needs. Approval of the recommended actions will allow Behavioral Wellness to continue to provide mandated substance use and ancillary services.

Background:

Behavioral Wellness is mandated by the California Welfare and Institutions Code to provide services to individuals with substance use issues in Santa Barbara County. Behavioral Wellness provides these services primarily through contracted providers. Services include a narcotic treatment program, and outpatient counseling and drug testing.

Aegis Treatment Centers (Aegis): Aegis operates a Narcotic Treatment Program (NTP) that provides methadone prescribed by a physician to alleviate withdrawal symptoms from narcotics. Aegis also conducts drug screening and provides clients with individual and group counseling. Clients who have substance abuse diagnoses and addictions to opiates receive services that support stabilization, rehabilitation and recovery. Due to unanticipated increases in demand for services, Behavioral Wellness is increasing Aegis' NTP Drug Medi-Cal funds by \$420,000 for FY 17-18 and \$420,000 for FY 18-19 in anticipation of a similar level of services being provided next fiscal year.

<u>Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center:</u> Coast Valley provides outpatient treatment services including individual and group counseling and drug testing in Santa Maria and Lompoc, and Alcohol and other Drugs (AOD) treatment services which are provided to Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) beneficiaries. In addition, they provide services to clients referred by the Santa Barbara County Drug Court. Due to unanticipated increases in demand for Alcohol and Drug Services for Outpatient Treatment, Behavioral Wellness is increasing Coast Valley's Santa Maria Outpatient Treatment program's Drug Medi-Cal funds by \$111,500 for this fiscal year.

LAGS Spine and Sportscare Medical Centers, Inc. (LAGS): LAGS operates an adult outpatient treatment program in Santa Maria to assist clients with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health issues to obtain and maintain sobriety. Treatment services include best practice outpatient individual and group counseling, drug testing and Naltrexone Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) MAT is the use of prescription medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a whole-person approach to the treatment of substance use disorders (SUD). Naltrexone tablets are for use only by prescribers trained in substance use disorder treatment. Contractor is certified to provide such treatment. Due to unanticipated increased demand for services, Behavioral Wellness is increasing LAGS' Drug Medi-Cal funds by \$22,500 this fiscal year.

Sanctuary Psychiatric Centers (Sanctuary): Sanctuary operates an adult outpatient treatment program to assist clients with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health issues to obtain and maintain sobriety. Treatment services include best practice outpatient individual and group counseling, and drug testing. Through Behavioral Wellness' contract, Sanctuary serves Drug Medi-Cal clients as well as Court-ordered adults referred by Santa Barbara Drug Courts. Due to unanticipated increased need for services caused by the termination of Phoenix of Santa Barbara, Inc., dba Crescend Health's Alcohol and Drug Program contract, Behavioral Wellness is increasing Sanctuary's Non-Drug Medi-Cal funds by \$83,400 for FY 17-18 and \$83,400 for FY 18-19 in anticipation of a similar level of services being provided next fiscal year.

Performance Measures and Outcomes: Aegis Treatment Centers

Aegis Treatment Centers, LLC (ATC) provides outpatient methadone treatment for opioid recovery to an average of 746 clients per quarter. Due to the nature of the treatment they provide, they are closely monitored by State and Federal agencies, in addition to the Department of Behavioral Wellness. ATC maintains a sophisticated Electronic Health Record system, from which they readily produce data for outcome monitoring. Aegis has performed well, having met and/or exceeded three of their four outcome goals.

Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center

Coast Valley provides Outpatient Drug Free (ODF) treatment to youth and adults in Santa Maria and Lompoc, serving an average of 461 adults and 58 adolescents per quarter. Coast Valley has performed

well in meeting its contract goals, with the exception of clients' successful completion of treatment, which has not always been met.

Sanctuary Psychiatric Centers

Sanctuary Psychiatric Centers provides Outpatient Drug Free (ODF) treatment services and Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOT) for clients with co-occurring disorders. These programs treat some of the most vulnerable and disabled clients, specifically those who have serious psychotic disorders such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder or schizoaffective disorder, in conjunction with a substance use disorder.

Sanctuary Psychiatric served an average of 116 clients per quarter, and performed very well, achieving and surpassing all outcome goals.

Narrative: The above reference contracts are funded by State and Federal funds. The Budget Revision Request is necessary to increase appropriations for Alcohol and Drug Program (ADP) CBOs' services as a result of the Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) mandate. Behavioral Wellness is requesting an increase in Services and Supplies due to \$637,400 additional DMC and State Realignment services provided by CBOs. These cost increases are funded by \$478,050 in Federal DMC and \$190,000 in State Aid-Drug Medi-Cal revenues. There is no impact to General Fund with this budget revision.

Key Contract Risks:

As with any contract funded by State and Federal Sources, there is a risk of future audit disallowances and repayments.

TO AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This is a third amendment (hereafter referred to as the "Third Amended Contract") to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor, referenced as number <u>BC 17-050</u>, by and between the **County of Santa Barbara** (County) and **Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara**, **Inc.** (Contractor), wherein Contractor agrees to provide and County agrees to accept the services specified herein.

Whereas, this Third Amended Contract incorporates the terms and conditions set forth in the contract approved by the County Board of Supervisors in June 2016 and the First Amended Contract approved in December 2016 and the Second Amended Contract approved in July 2017, except as modified by this Third Amended Contract;

Whereas, the County has an unanticipated need for additional Alcohol and Drug Program services for clients previously served by another Alcohol and Drug Program that was terminated by the provider, and Contractor is certified to provide these services;

Whereas, County anticipates that Contractor will provide, at the request of the County, additional services, and will incur expenses beyond the original value of the Agreement, this amendment adds Alcohol and Drug funds in the amount of \$83,400 per year for FY 17-18 and FY 18-19 to the prior annual maximum amount of \$301,790, increasing the total maximum Contract Amount for FY 16-19 from \$918,370 to \$1,085,170 so as to compensate Contractor for the additional services to be rendered under this Agreement through June 30, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the arties agree as follows:

- I. In <u>Exhibit B Financial Provisions</u>, delete <u>Section II -- Maximum Contract Amount</u> and replace with the following:
 - II. MAXIMUM CONTRACT AMOUNT.

The Maximum Contract Amount of this Agreement shall not exceed \$314,790 for fiscal year for FY 16-17, \$385,190 for FY 17-18, and \$385,190 for FY 18-19, for a total multi-year amount not to exceed \$1,085,170, and shall consist of County, State, and/or Federal funds as shown in Exhibit B-1-ADP. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall County pay Contractor more than this Maximum Contract Amount for Contractor's performance hereunder without a properly executed amendment.
