My name is Marc Appleton, I am a resident of Santa Barbara County, I have known about Janice Feldman's diligent and conscientious efforts to have her proposed home approved for some time, and, as a local architect, am familiar with the plans and how responsive they are to the site, neighborhood and environment.

Since first approved by the South County board of Architectural Review in 2013 and subsequently by Zoning in 2014, this project has been needlessly challenged and appealed by one neighbor at great expense to both the Applicant and the County.

I am all for the public review process, but this is a spurious appeal motivated by selfish interests, and the appeal has been adequately addressed. A site plan comparison between the Applicant's existing and proposed new home indicates a clear improvement to the neighbor's ocean views. The site plan also indicates

that the Applicant's proposal maintains significantly more open space for wetlands restoration than neighboring parcels do, the proposed footprint of the new home covering less than 3% of the lot.


As a local Carpinterian and friend of Janice Feldman, I would like to support her home building plan at 755 Sand Point Road.
