Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Scooters have arrived

- City of SB came and went: arrived early summer and were subsequently banned by emergency ordinance pending ordinance changes
- County arrived in Isla Vista in September. No regulating ordinances currently in place.
- UCSB banned pending further discussion
- City of Goleta arrived mid October, no regulating ordinances currently in place.






Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

- Car, bike and scooter sharing
 - Carshare was covered by a temporary Ordinance
 - Bikeshare minimally covered by Resolution
 - Scooters (Shared Mobility Devices, or SMDs) are not in the current code
- Use of the right-of-way for business purposes
 - Vending code section exists, but needs updating due to case law


Outdoor Dining covers Isla Vista only



Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Bike share Chapter 9 – Bicycles

- Defines and regulates bicycles and skateboards
- No identified locations for use of right-of-way
- Does not include provisions for motorized bicycles
- Does not include use of right-of-way for bike share
- Does not establish fees
- On-demand services have begun in Isla Vista




Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Car share

Sec. 23-11.12. Car share permit parking spaces within Isla Vista

- •Initiated in 2010-2011
- Pilot Program initiated in code
- Locations identified by Resolution
 Fees not established




Scooters and other shared mobility devices (SMDs)

- Not included in current County Code
- •On-demand scooter services have begun in Isla Vista

Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Outdoor Dining

Sec. 28-130. Allows for use, regulation, and fees within road right-of-way for dining

- •Initiated in 2012
- Establishes guidelines for use of right-of-way for business purposes
- Allows for regulation and fees (per square foot)
- Updated annually



Recommended Modifications

Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Purpose of Modifications

So businesses using the right-of-way ensure they are operating safely and not creating a nuisance

Approach

- 1) Adopt Ordinance to begin oversight of operations
- 2) Adjust Ordinance, Resolutions, and permits as needed









Recommended Modifications

Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

Chapter 9- BICYCLES, <u>SKATEBOARDS</u>, <u>SCOOTERS</u>, AND ON-DEMAND MOBILITY SERVICES

Defines

- Bicycles
 - Non-motorized
 - "E-bikes" (3 classes, depending on top speed)
 - Motorized bicycles and other classes
- Skateboards
- Scooters and other on-demand shared mobility services (SMD): electric and motorized
- Spaces in right-of-way designated for exclusive use of these vehicles
- Businesses offering on-demand SMD services

Provides guidance and regulation of

- Operation of businesses providing SMD services
- Allowed use of right-of-way for these services
- Provisions for impounding, fees, insurance and compliance (through encroachment permit process)


Main Bldg Outdoor Dining

Chapter 23- Parking

Modifications allow for On-Demand Shared Mobility Device (SMD) operators to use the right-of-way for business, with permit conditions

Chapter 28

Modifications allow for <u>countywide</u> outdoor dining and SMDs to use the right-of-way with permit conditions, regulation and fees



Next Steps

Road Encroachment Ordinance Update

- If approved, come back with Resolution to set fees for annual permits and impound
- 2) Develop annual permit conditions for things like:
 - Permit application requirements
 - Insurance requirements
 - Fleet size limit options
 - Data sharing requirements
 - Requirements for renewal
- 3) Monitor and discuss with regional partners and update ordinances and processes as warranted

Potential Fee Structure

- Application fee
- Per vehicle fee
- Fee for square feet of dedicated right of way
- Impound fee
