

Federal Accomplishments

Accomplishments

- Reauthorization of the Children's Health Insurance Program through FY 2027;
- A two-year extension of funding for Federally Qualified Health Centers;
- Enactment of FY 2018 Supplemental Appropriations for disaster recovery;
- Enactment of H.R. 302, the Disaster Recovery Reform Act, to reauthorize and increase funding for disaster preparedness and hazard mitigation grants.
- Payments in Lieu of Taxes funding to the County of \$1.86 million;
- HUD funding to the County of \$1.19 million from the Community Development Block Grant program, \$1 million from the HOME Investment Program, and \$662,839 from the Capital Fund;
- \$1.7 million in Continuum of Care awards for ongoing projects in the County serving the homeless;
- Enactment of H.R. 6 to strengthen prevention and public health efforts to address the opioids crisis;
- House passage and Senate Committee approval of H.R. 1491, the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians Land Affirmation Act, to implement the County's agreement regarding Camp 4 (currently pending in the Lame Duck Session).



State Accomplishments

Accomplishments

- Successfully supported AB 1775 and SB 834, which prohibits the State Lands Commission (SLC) from entering into any new lease authorizing new construction of oil-and-gas-related infrastructure
- Successfully included the Santa Barbara County Department of Child Support Services' recommended clarifying amendments to AB 3248
- Successfully opposed SB 827 which would have required the County to grant housing development projects, in key transit corridors, a "bonus" by exempting the project from certain local development requirements.
- Successfully worked with CSAC and the author's office to remove any language in the bill that would make a change to inverse condemnation in the bill, and supported the legislation in its final form.(SB901)



State Accomplishments

Accomplishments

- Property Tax Backfill
- Debris Removal Cost Share Waiver
- Elimination of the 340B Program: Rejected
- Successfully supported SB 821, which allows a county to enter into an agreement with utilities to access the contact information of resident accountholders for the sole purpose of enrolling county residents in a county operated public emergency warning system.
- Supported SB 917, which provides that if loss or damage results from a combination of perils, one of which is a debris flow, an insurer shall provide coverage if an insured peril is cause of the loss or damage and coverage would otherwise be provided for the insured peril.
- Successful in securing \$4,000,000 in grant funds awards to the Santa Barbara County Public Works Department to develop an Anaerobic Digestion Facility at the County-owned and operated Tajiguas Landfill.
