#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors considers recommendations as follows:

- a) Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair and required County Directors and Officers to certify the Children's Medical Services Plan for funding from the State Department of Health Services for the Children's Medical Services program for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, in the amount of \$1,958,391.
- b) Determine that the approval, ratification and certification of the above Plan is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act review per CEQA Guideline Section 15378(b)(4), since the recommended action is for government fiscal activity that does not involve commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

#### **Summary Text:**

This item is on the agenda to certify the plan and budget for funding from the State Department of Health Services for the Children's Medical Services (CMS) program for Fiscal Year 2018-19 as follows:

The CMS Plan for FY 2018-19 includes budgets for both CHDP and CCS and is always submitted midyear.

The County is responsible for one-half of the costs of the non-Medi-Cal children served by the CCS Administration program per Health and Safety Code section 123955(e)(1), as shown below in the Funding Overview table. Because the vast majority of the children are Medi-Cal eligible, the local cost sharing contribution is projected at approximately 2.7% of the total budgeted funding.

#### **Background:**

The CMS program provides a comprehensive system of health care for children through preventive screening, diagnostics, treatment, rehabilitation and follow-up services. This program is comprised of three components: CHDP for low-income children, HCPCFC for children in foster care and in the child welfare system, and CCS for children with specific health conditions.

The local CHDP program is responsible for implementation of state and federal regulations pertaining to the CHDP program that includes medical provider recruitment and quality reviews, ongoing medical provider support, outreach to families with eligible children, community education, community collaboration and care coordination. The CHDP program in the community provides health assessments and services by enrolled private physicians, local health departments, community clinics and managed care plans to low income children in California.

The CHDP program also includes HCPCFC. HCPCFC is a mandated public health nursing program implemented through county Child Welfare Service (CWS) agencies and Probation Departments. The HCPCFC program, as outlined by the California DSS, works to provide public health nurse (PHN) expertise in meeting the medical, dental, mental and developmental needs of children and youth in foster care.

The CCS program provides financial, residential, and medical eligibility determination services for all CCS children and referrals. The CCS program also provides diagnostic and treatment services, medical case management (for children not enrolled as CenCal Health members) and physical and occupational therapy services to children under age 21 with CCS-eligible medical conditions. Examples of CCS-eligible conditions include, but are not limited to, cystic fibrosis, hemophilia, cerebral palsy, heart disease, cancer, traumatic injuries, and some infectious diseases.
