SUBJECT: Adopting a Parking Restriction in the Fourth Supervisorial District

Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Adopt the attached Resolution to establish a new parking restriction in the Fourth Supervisorial District; and
- b) Find that the proposed action is for the operation and maintenance of an existing public facility, involving negligible, or no expansion of use beyond that which presently exists, that the proposed action is therefore exempt from California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to 14 CCR 15301(c), and approve and direct staff to file the attached Notice of Exemption on that basis.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda to establish a new parking restriction on Blosser Road in the Fourth Supervisorial District.

Proposed Parking Restrictions

Pursuant to County Code 23-11 and California Vehicle Code Section 22507, the Board of Supervisors, by Resolution may regulate vehicle parking on certain streets or highways, or portions thereof, during all or certain hours of the day.

Blosser Road – Fourth Supervisorial District

Public Works recommends that your Board adopt the proposed parking restriction on the east side of Blosser Road, in the unincorporated area of Orcutt (Vicinity Map 1). Local residents requested the County install "No Stopping, Standing, or Parking" zones to guarantee line of sight for vehicles making a turn from Terrazzo Way onto Blosser Rd. Vehicles parking on the east side of Blosser Road are creating a sight distance problem for drivers trying to turn in either direction from Terrazzo Way onto Blosser Road. Public Works reviewed the location and recommends the following parking restrictions to

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provide adequate stopping sight distance. Staff determined there will be adequate parking for the current demand.

The Public Works Department prepared the attached Resolution to adopt the parking restriction at the following location:

FOURTH DISTRICT – Orcutt Area

ADOPT

No Stopping, Standing, or Parking Zone

• On the east side of Blosser Road from a point 198 feet north of centerline of Terrazzo Way to a point 316 feet south of the centerline of Terrazzo Way

Background:

Parking restrictions are established based on safety, necessity, and community benefit. Public Works weighs all of these factors and presents any recommended changes to your Board for approval. These parking restrictions may include, but are not limited to "No Stopping, Standing, or Parking", "Time Limited" parking, "Loading" zones, "Vehicle Height Restricted" parking, "Angle" parking, or any combination of restrictions.

Public Works has surveyed the proposed traffic control location described in this Board Letter, and found it to be in the best interest of the community and the traveling public to install the proposed traffic control. Public Works recommends your Board's approval of the attached Resolution to implement the traffic control.

The proposed action is for the operation and maintenance of an existing public facility, involving negligible, or no expansion of use beyond that which presently exists and is therefore exempt from California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to 14 CCR 15301(c), and does not require approval of the California Environmental Quality Act.
