## Summary Text:

On June 13, 2019, the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury published a report entitled "Railroad Fatalities in Santa Barbara County". Today, the Board will consider the proposed response to the report, adopt their preferred response and authorize the Board Chair to sign the response letter. The Board is required to respond in writing to the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court by September 11, 2019.

## **Background:**

On June 13, 2019, the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury published a report entitled "Railroad Fatalities in Santa Barbara County"

The Grand Jury concluded that: "The 20 railroad-related deaths that occurred in the 109-mile County railroad corridor during the 2015 through 2018 period are significant and are concentrated within two small areas of track, (High Fatality Zones) HFZl and HFZ2. A reduction in pedestrian trespassing deaths, including suicides and transient/homeless deaths, can best be secured by restricting access to and providing additional security in the HFZs. Other jurisdictions in the state of California have achieved success in reducing the number of railroad fatalities by constructing a sealed corridor. A sealed corridor could be constructed from Ortega Hill to Glen Annie Road, essentially spanning the cities of Santa Barbara and Goleta. For maximum effectiveness, the proposed Santa Barbara-Goleta corridor would require a program to:

- mend existing fences and erect new ones
- remove overgrown foliage in the right-of-way area
- improve security patrols by negotiating MOUs with local law enforcement
- increase surveillance by installing video cameras to monitor pedestrian trespassing and transient/homeless encampments.
- A collaboration between all stakeholders, including scheduling regular meetings, will improve railroad safety measures in the County".

The Board of Supervisors are named as responders to Findings 1 through 6 as well as Recommendations 1-6a and 6b.

The Sheriff's Office is named as a responder to Finding and Recommendation 3.

### Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

Staff anticipates no fiscal or facilities impacts as a result of the Board's action on this matter.
