That the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to submit an application and sign the Grant Award Agreement for anticipated funds in the amount of \$532,253 from the California Emergency Management Agency (Cal EMA) Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program, as provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act 2009 (ARRA).

Summary Text:

The Probation Department anticipates receiving \$532,253 in ARRA funds to implement an Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program. The Request for Applications (RFA) was released on November 2, amended on November 17, 2009 and the application for funding must be submitted to Cal EMA by December 31, 2009. Due to the limited number of Board Hearings for the month of December and a RFA requirement for Board authorization, this matter is submitted for preliminary authorization with the intent to re-calendar the item upon notice that the Department's application has been accepted for funding. At the subsequent hearing, the Department will provide a complete fiscal and personnel accounting of the proposed project, as well as any necessary request for budget revision.

A project team is currently expediting the exploration and planning of options regarding facilities, staffing and program components with the intent to expand the current effort to implement a Santa Maria Probation Report and Resource Center. These funds provide the opportunity for the Department to deliver a similar program in the south county area. The Centers will focus on reducing recidivism by delivering evidence-based strategies and programming to adult felons on probation. Probationers at highest risk for incarceration in the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) will be the primary target population. Criminogenic needs will be assessed utilizing a validated assessment tool. Services may include intensive case management guided by a needs assessment, participation in cognitive behavioral groups, drug testing, referrals for treatment and the utilization of graduated sanctions. Collaboration with community based organizations for the provision of services and employment readiness through development of community connections will also be emphasized.

Background:

On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Public Law 111-5, or "ARRA") with the intended purpose of creating/maintaining jobs and reenergizing the economy. As part of the package, ARRA includes funding to various federal agencies for a multitude of federal programs and almost \$2 billion in critical resources for state and local law enforcement and other criminal justice activities through the Recovery Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program. Cal EMA, as the State Administrative Agency (SAA) in California, was awarded over \$135 million under the Recovery JAG Program and of this amount, over \$44 million has been allocated to support the Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program (EBPSP).

Funding for the EBPSP will be distributed proportionately to qualifying county probation departments based on each county's population of adults 18 to 25 years of age, provided that each county receive a minimum of \$33,000. Santa Barbara County's portion of the allocation has been determined to be \$532,253. These are one-time grant funds for expenditure between October 1, 2009 and September 30, 2012.

The intent of the program is to provide funding to county probation departments for the purpose of providing evidence-based supervision, programs, or services to adult felony probationers to reduce the likelihood that these probationers will commit new crimes or other violations resulting in a state prison sentence. To receive funding, departments must demonstrate that the programs for which they are seeking funds are evidenced-based and targeted toward adult felony probationers. An evidence-based program for adult probationers must have empirical evidence that the program has been shown to reduce rates of re-offending, re-arrest, re-conviction, or re-incarceration for program participants or that the program is considered a best practice in criminal justice literature.
