URBAN FORESTRY MAINTENANCE WORKER II

EST:

DEFINITION: Under general supervision, performs a variety of semi-skilled and skilled manual work in the installation of concrete sidewalks, ADA ramps, curbs, gutters, drive aprons, and monolithic sidewalks; trimming, removal, installation, and transplanting of County street trees; installation and patching of asphalt paved roadways; and performs related duties as required.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS: Urban Forestry Maintenance Worker I/II is a flexibly-staffed class series in the Public Works Department. Urban Forestry Maintenance Worker I is the working class and Urban Forestry Maintenance Worker II is the journey-level class in the series. Urban Forestry Maintenance Worker II incumbents work with less supervision and perform more skilled tasks, which may include driving commercial vehicles requiring a Class B Commercial Driver's License.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Depending on assignment, duties may include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Performs journey-level concrete finishing work; designs and builds forms, requiring an understanding of percentages, slopes, angles, and elevations; places and finishes concrete projects such as sidewalks using power tools; performs grading and elevations framing and finish detail work.
- 2. Reads and interprets plans and standard details.
- 3. Operates an aerial lift to climb trees using ropes, slings, saddles, or spikes.
- 4. Trims trees and completes takedowns of trees while cabling and bracing using hand and power tools; rigging fallen trees requiring knowledge of tree pruning techniques; installs new 15-24 box gallon trees; maintains shrubbery and applies mulch; installs irrigation lines.
- 5. Operates vehicles, including pickups, flat-beds, backhoes, mini-loaders, and small dump trucks; performs equipment maintenance duties; ensures vehicles are serviced and maintained.
- 6. Works with or completes work for Parks and General Services departments, as well as other divisions of the Public Works Department.
- 7. Completes written time cards, daily work logs, and equipment maintenance logs.
- 8. Attends safety training sessions to learn and review safe work practices; reads and reviews written safety instructions, MSDS labels, and training materials; and applies safety knowledge learned to daily work practices.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS:

- 1. Two years of maintenance, construction, or related experience that included concrete finishing and/or tree trimming, removal, and installation experience; or
- 2. One year of experience performing duties equivalent to an Urban Forestry Maintenance Worker I with Santa Barbara County; or
- 3. A combination of training, education, and experience that is equivalent to the employment standards listed above and that provides the required knowledge and abilities.

Additional Requirements:

 Possession of a valid California Class B Commercial Driver's License at the time of application. California Class B Commercial Driver's License and required endorsements must be kept valid and maintained as a condition of continued employment

Appointees who have a current valid out-of-state CDL must obtain at minimum, a California Class B Commercial Driver's License CDL by the time of appointment.

Appointees to assignments in this classification will be subject to mandatory testing for drugs prior to beginning work; once on the job, incumbents will be subject to mandatory testing for drugs and/or alcohol on a random, reasonable suspicion, post-accident, return-to-duty, and follow-up basis. In addition, certain positions may require specific license endorsements.

Knowledge of: the materials; safety practices, and tools commonly used in concrete finishing work; safety methods, ISA practices, procedures, tools, and equipment used in climbing, trimming, installing, transplanting, and removing trees; irrigation line installation procedures and safety methods; preventive maintenance and safe operation of aerial booms, pickups, flat-beds, backhoes, mini-loaders, small dump trucks, laser levels, and power tools; safe driving rules and practices; and safe lifting and carrying practices.

Ability to: perform a variety of semiskilled manual maintenance and construction tasks for extended periods of time and under unfavorable weather conditions; climb and work at considerable heights; safely use, operate, and maintain equipment and tools utilized in the urban forestry field, such as aerial booms, chippers, pickups, flat-beds, backhoes, mini-loaders, small dump trucks, and other specialized equipment; safely use and maintain hand and power tools and equipment commonly used in concrete finishing work, such as concrete saws; read and interpret plans, follow basic safety policies and procedures; safely lift and carry heavy objects; understand and follow oral and written instructions; follow departmental safety practices and procedures; keep simple written records and reports; work independently and as part of a team; and develop and maintain effective and cooperative work relationships with those contacted in the course of work, including other crew members and the general public.

Desirable Qualifications:

• Credentialing as an International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Certified Tree Worker Aerial Lift Specialist

Supplemental Information: Incumbents may be exposed to a variety of hazardous and/or unpleasant field conditions, including: rainy, cold, or hot weather; traffic; dust and exhaust fumes; electricity and electrical hazards; high noise levels; and working at heights of up to 55 feet. Performing the essential functions of this classification requires various types of physical exertion, such as prolonged walking, bending, and stooping; walking on uneven terrain; climbing ladders; lifting and moving objects of up to 40 pounds; and driving vehicles and/or equipment for long periods of time.
