PART 3: PROJECT DESCRIPTION

THIS PROJECT COMPLIES WITH FG CODE 13103(E), IMPROVEMENT OF WILDLIFE HABITAT.

This project has become necessary now that CDFW will be returning to the necessary practice of using cattle grazing as a habitat management tool. Several project sites within the Cuyama River drainage need wildlife friendly fencing installed around troughs and guzzlers to prevent damage to, and monopolization of, the wildlife water sources by stock. Many organizations, including SBCFC, have donated funding and volunteer efforts in the establishment of these wildlife water sources and this investment must not be placed at risk.

The fence is a three-strand onfiguration: 1 barb, 1 smooth, 1 barb, that has proven easy for deer, antelope and other wildlife to pass through but which generally prevent cattle intrusion. Elk jump over whatever fence is in place. It is estimated that 2400' of fencing will be required for the 5 projects. This will be a contractor installed project. Fence installation, while not complex, requires experienced installers. All sites are within the Cuyama Valley drainage hydrology.

The following wildlife water projects will be served by this project: 1) Johnson Flat Windmill trough, 2) Chicken Water Flats troughs, 3) Carrizo Canyon Windmill trough, 4) White Rock trough, 5) Yellow Jacket Canyon trough. These projects have already seen substantial grant funding by Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, California Deer Association, Santa Maria Valley Sportsmen's Association, and County of Santa Barbara.

CRF volunteers will mark and stake the perimeter on each project and maintain the fencing after installation.

All project sites have been previously CEQA approved with the original project.


