Consider recommendations regarding Behavioral Wellness Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018 Amendments and FY 2018-2019 extension, Institutions for Mental Disease/Residential Mental Health Contracts, as follows:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Merced Behavioral Center (not a local vendor), an Institution for Mental Disease, to increase the FY 2017-2018 contract by \$119,585.00 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,769,585.00 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020;
- b) Approve, ratify and authorize the Chair to execute a First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Psynergy Programs, Inc., (not a local vendor) for the provision of adult residential mental health services, to increase the FY 2017-2018 contract by \$87,707.00 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,861,256.00 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020;
- c) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Sylmar Health and Rehabilitation Center (not a local vendor), an Institution for Mental Disease, to increase the FY 2017-2018 contract by \$264,011.00 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,564,011.00 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020;
- d) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the First Amendment to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Vista Pacifica Enterprises, Inc. (not a local vendor), an Institution for Mental Disease and a Skilled Nursing Facility, to increase the FY 2017-2018 contract by \$113,662.00 and to extend the term of the Agreement into Fiscal Year 2018-2019 for an additional \$300,000.00, for a total contract maximum amount not to exceed \$1,026,962.00 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019; and
- e) Determine that these activities are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review per CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5) since the recommended actions are government administrative activities which do not involve commitment to any specific project which may result in potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

Summary Text:

The Department of Behavioral Wellness provides a continuum of mental health and substance use disorder services to Santa Barbara County residents, in part through contracted providers including Community-Based Organizations (CBOs). Contracts with facilities providing services at various levels of care are key to ensuring that the needs of clients are optimally met. Due to an increased demand for inpatient contracted long-term beds, Behavioral Wellness needs to amend several of its Institutions for Mental Disease (IMD) contracts to increase funding for FY 17-18. These amendments will be funded by savings from underutilized IMD contracts. Two of contracts referred to in the recommendations above are one year contracts and therefore we are also taking this opportunity to extend their terms into the following Fiscal Year. Approval of the recommended actions will allow Behavioral Wellness to continue to provide mandated mental health, substance use, and ancillary services.

Background:

Institutions for Mental Disease (IMD): Behavioral Wellness provides a continuum of services, including inpatient treatment services to best meet the needs of individuals with severe mental illness. IMDs are facilities including hospitals, nursing facilities, or other institutions of more than 16 beds that are primarily engaged in providing diagnosis, treatment, or care of persons with mental illness, including medical attention, nursing care, and related services. Due to the Federal IMD Exclusion, these services are not reimbursable by Medi-Cal for clients between the ages of 21 and 65. There are a limited number of these highly structured residential treatment services in California and none in Santa Barbara County. Behavioral Wellness examines the current caseload and historical use of IMD facilities in order to project the following year's contract amounts within Department's budget constraints. Behavioral Wellness contracts with IMDs that are licensed as Acute Psychiatric Hospitals, Skilled Nursing Facilities with Special Treatment Patches (Sylmar Health & Rehabilitation Center and California Psychiatric Transitions), and Mental Health Rehabilitation Centers. Acute Psychiatric Hospitals (Aurora Las Encinas) are used only for clients with emergency mental health needs who are determined to be a danger to themselves or others or gravely disabled pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code §5150, and bed rates are significantly higher due to the hospital license, compared with other types of IMDs, which are locked facilities used to treat ongoing psychiatric needs. Due to limited bed availability at each IMD, Behavioral Wellness contracts with a number of IMDs throughout the State.

Behavioral Wellness also contracts with IMD-alternative facilities (Psynergy), which are unlocked facilities providing highly structural residential programs for clients transitioning out of IMDs.

Merced Behavioral Center (Merced), located in Merced County, provides intensive psychiatric mental health treatment, medical assessment, diagnosis, and monitoring in a locked setting. For the first half of the current fiscal year, Merced has consistently held a caseload of 9-10 clients per month. The current funding projections are based on a caseload of 11 clients per month for the second half of the fiscal year.

Psynergy Programs, Inc. (**Psynergy**), located in the Bay Area, provides residential treatment services to adult clients as a step-down from IMDs. Psynergy works with clients in IMDs to identify clients who may be ready to step down to a lower level of care, then works to step clients down through three progressions of residential care, with the eventual goal of equipping clients to return to Santa Barbara County to live independently. For the first half of the current fiscal year, Psynergy has consistently held a caseload of 11-14 clients. The current funding projections are based on a caseload of 15 clients per month for the second half of the fiscal year.

Sylmar Health & Rehabilitation Center (Sylmar) is a locked facility for adults with severe mental illness located in Los Angeles County. Sylmar provides intensive psychiatric mental health treatment, medical assessment, diagnosis and monitoring, and treatment groups for clients, including those diagnosed with co-occurring disorders. This facility is able to accommodate medically complex or fragile individuals. For the first half of the current fiscal year, Sylmar has consistently held a caseload of 15-18 clients per month. The current funding projections are based on a caseload of 17 clients per month for the second half of the fiscal year.

Vista Pacifica Enterprises, Inc. (VPE) has two California facilities: Vista Pacifica Center located in Jurupa Valley and Vista Pacifica Convalescent in Riverside. Vista Pacifica Center specializes in geropsychology and offers four levels of service for residents that require high levels of supervision such as those whose behavioral and medical needs include: being absent without leave, extremely verbally aggressive or threatening and abusive towards staff and peers. They also include behaviors such as being suicidal, destroying property, and having severe psychosis which requires frequent redirection, counseling, and behavior modification form staff. Vista Pacifica Convalescent specializes in Alzheimer's Care and offers three levels of care: Level A focuses on residents with chronic mental health diagnosis, with active delusions and hallucinations and/or mood swings. Level B focuses on residents with duel diagnoses of Dementia and chronic mental illness with active psychosis. Level C focuses on residents with chronic mental health illness who are not stable on medications. For the first half of the current fiscal year, VPE has consistently held a caseload of 8-10 clients per month. The current funding projections are based on a caseload of 13 clients per month for the second half of the fiscal year

TO AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This First Amendment (hereafter First Amended Contract) to the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor, referenced as number **BC18-074** is made by and between the County of Santa Barbara (County) and Psynergy Programs, Inc. (Contractor), for the continued provision of services specified herein.

Whereas, Contractor represents that it is specially trained, skilled, experienced and competent to perform the special services required by County and County desires to retain the services of Contractor pursuant to the terms, covenants, and conditions referenced herein; and

Whereas, this First Amended Contract incorporates the terms and conditions set forth in the contract approved by the County Board of Supervisors in June 2017, except as modified by this First Amended Contract.

Whereas, County anticipates that Contractor will provide, at the request of the County, a greater number of services than contemplated by the original Agreement, and will incur expenses beyond the value of this Agreement. This Amendment adds funds in the amount of \$148,000 for Fiscal Year 17-18 to the prior FY 17-18 maximum of \$773,549so as to compensate Contractor for additional services to be rendered under this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, County and Contractor agree as follows:

I. Delete Section II, Maximum Contract Amount, from Exhibit B, Financial Provisions, and replace with the following:

II. MAXIMUM CONTRACT AMOUNT.

The Maximum Contract Amount of this Agreement shall not exceed \$921,549 for FY 17-18, \$500,000 for FY 18-19, and \$500,000 for FY 19-20, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,921,549 during the term of this agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event shall County pay Contractor more than this Maximum Contract Amount for Contractor's performance hereunder without a properly executed amendment.

II. Delete Exhibit B-1, Schedule of Rates and Contract Maximum, and replace with the following:
