#### **Budget Narrative**

The budget for the Elder Abuse Program incorporates the equivalent of salary and benefit costs totaling \$193,574 (salary) and \$116,065 (benefits) for one 1.0 FTE Victim Witness Program Advocate-II for the grant period. The Advocate has previous experience and familiarity with the criminal justice system and be knowledgeable of the elder/dependent adult population. She is a bilingual Spanish/English speaking advocate who meets the job specifications which include an education in the social sciences or criminal justice and experience working with victims of crime. Additionally the candidate has experience with public speaking and outreach activities. The Advocate provides services countywide in each of the distinct areas, Santa Barbara, Santa Maria and Lompoc. She possesses knowledge of the community and its resources and has completed the required OES mandated advocate training which provides a framework for Advocacy work within a Victim-Witness Program including a thorough overview of Mandated and Optional Services. Total cost for the mandated OES VW training is \$1080 for 5 days in Sacramento at CDAA (California District Attorney's Association). The Advocate is responsible for all direct provision of comprehensive Victim/Witness services. Witness Program Manager will allocate 5% of her time to oversee the development of the Elder Abuse Program and provide day to day supervision of the grant objectives and activities. The Manager has been employed with the District Attorney's Office for 23 years in the Victim-Witness Division and has previous experience implementing an Elder Abuse Program. The total Salary and Benefit Cost for this purpose for the grant period is \$25,020 and constitutes a portion of the cash match.

The District Attorney's Office is fortunate to have access to a retired extra-help Deputy District Attorney who is an expert in Elder and Dependent Abuse Prosecution and can provide outreach and education in concert with the assigned advocate. This is an added benefit as this individual will provide outreach related to mandatory reporting, prosecutable crimes and act as a

resource to law enforcement, the general public, adult protective services and the long term care ombudsman. The attorney will be assigned .40 FTE and can guide law enforcement and adult protective services to provide tips for a successful investigation and ultimately ensuring a successful prosecution. A portion of her total salary totaling 88,033 will constitute a portion of the match of \$60,722 for the grant period. Since she is an extra help retired employee benefit costs are mitigated.

Training Costs include funding for Multi-Disciplinary Team members to attend a 3-day California District Attorney's Office sponsored National Elder Abuse Symposium or a similar educational program. The Annual program is designed for prosecutors, investigators, law enforcement, adult protective services, victim advocates, medical and mental health professionals, coroners and medical examiners. The symposium provides information on how to identify, investigate and prosecute cases involving elder and dependent adult abuse and provides an opportunity to learn best practices from other multi-disciplinary teams across the country. The cost of 4 individuals attending the annual conference during the program period, \$8491 which includes the state allowed travel and per diem rates. Also included in the operating budget is the Mandatory Program Meeting attendance for the MDT members with a budget that includes 2 nights of lodging, travel and per diem for each grant year, \$10,038. Travel costs assume airfare costs for the 4 MDT members.

The budget includes partial costs of organizing and implementing an outreach and awareness program in collaboration with the Elder and Dependent Adult Abuse Prevention Council. The Council is facilitated by the Area Agency on Aging and includes Adult Protective Services, Tri County Regional Center, LTC Long Term Care Ombudsman, the District Attorney's Office, the Public Guardian's Office, the County Department of Mental Health and Public Health, all integral to this program's success. Specifically funds are dedicated to coordinating an annual Stand Up Against Elder Abuse Conference. Costs include facility rental, AV/Technical fees, Speaker costs, outreach and marketing materials. The \$12,148 cost of coordinating the

conference constitutes a portion of the cash match. The goal of the outreach campaign and conference is to educate the community regarding elder/dependent adult abuse, identify vulnerable victim populations, increase reporting and provide resource and referral information for countywide stakeholders. An additional \$7376 is budgeted to produce outreach materials including a community elder/dependent adult resource cards with helpful phone numbers and contacts as well as "Neck Wallets" popular with seniors. The neck wallets are an ideal outreach item which holds the resource card and important contact information for service providers. The operating budget also includes the cost of purchasing radio and TV time for public service announcements regarding identifying and reporting elder/dependent abuse. The Program will enter into a contract with Emerald Wave Radio and its affiliate partner Univision Costa Central. Emerald Wave Media has a JSA (Joint Sales Agreement) with Entravision. Entravision own's the Univision affiliation for both Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo county. Emerald Wave Media is the sole exclusive agents for Entravision's two local TV stations KPMR (Univision) and KTSB (Unimas). The estimated cost is \$21,000 for the grant period. This can include the production of a regular live radio show which includes a Q and A with the Elder Program Staff as well as weekly two minute TV Public Service Announcements aired to the Spanish Speaking Community.

Operating expenses also include \$2409 in funds for the purchase of an HP Desktop computer, monitor, docking station, mouse and keyboard for the assigned advocate assigned full time during start-up to track mandated and optional services and capture grant related statistics. The computer will also be utilized for outreach efforts. Lastly, the operating expenses include costs attributed to necessary office furniture for the Advocate; desk, chair, side chair and table totaling \$3400. The Extra Help Attorney will utilize existing space and furniture thereby mitigating additional expenses.

The District Attorney's Office Administrative Office will absorb the costs of grant and fiscal reporting.

#### **Independent Contractor and Consultant**

The Santa Barbara County Annual Training Conference is a collaboration between the District Attorney's Office XE Staff and the Area Agency on Aging. The Conference is included in the Work Plan for the Elder & Dependent Adult Abuse Council of Santa Barbara County. A committee is created for each activity in the Work Plan.

The Conference Committee includes 4-5 people from a variety of agencies who serve elders and dependent adults. The committee generally meets 9 months of the year.

To begin the committee work, they review the suggested topics from the prior year's Evaluations. We generally receive 40-50% return of Conference evaluations and some good suggestions. The committee also considers information from a variety of sources, such as the Elder Abuse listserve from the National Center on Elder Abuse.

The two speakers from the May 2017 conference were selected by the committee based on the topics desired for the conference and experience of direct service workers. Specifically, Dr. Judith Smith was selected based on a Research to Practice (R2P) report. See attached item. Mr. Neil Granger was selected because one of the Council members had heard him speak at a statewide conference and the Council agreed that information about annuities would benefit the attendees of the training conference. These are complex financial documents and Mr. Granger is a well-known speaker/advocate for the consumer. I believe we watched a video he produced on You Tube.

Despite the volume of reported verified and confirmed elder/dependent abuse cases, statistics regarding those cases that were cross-reported to Law Enforcement and ultimately the District Attorney's Office are minimal. Only 27 cases reached the District Attorney's Office for review and of those, 35 had successful criminal outcome constituting 25 Felonies and 10 misdemeanors. Additionally there were only 125 victims of elder abuse served by the Victim-Witness Assistance Program between 2014-2015. There is a clear gap between the number of reports made to both Adult Protective Services and the Ombudsman which this grant serves to address.
