AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR (CONTRACT NO. BC19-162)

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 1 hereby amends the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor (hereafter Agreement) dated December 11, 2018 between the County of Santa Barbara, a political subdivision of the State of California (hereafter COUNTY) and Ernst and Young (hereafter CONTRACTOR).

The Agreement is amended as follows:

- 1. Section 4. Term is hereby amended to read as follows: "CONTRACTOR shall commence performance on February 27, 2018 and end performance upon completion, but no later than August 31, 2019 unless otherwise directed by COUNTY or unless earlier terminated. The parties agree this Agreement shall hereby cancel, nullify, and supersede Purchase Contract CN21596."
- 2. Exhibit B, Section A is hereby amended to read as follows: "For CONTRACTOR services to be rendered under this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall be paid a total contract amount, including cost reimbursements, up to but not to exceed \$1,180,000."
- 3. Attachment B1 is deleted and replaced in its entirety as attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Ratifications. The terms and provisions set forth in this Amendment No. 1 shall modify and supersede all inconsistent terms and provisions set forth in the Agreement. The terms and provisions of the Agreement, except as expressly modified and superseded by this Amendment No. 1, are ratified and confirmed and shall continue in full force and effect, and shall continue to be legal, valid, binding, and enforceable obligations of the parties.

Counterparts. This Amendment No. 1 may be executed in several counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute a single agreement between the parties.

FEMA recognizes that there are extraordinary costs associated with administering disaster programs. As part of FEMA's Public Assistance Program, recipients can recoup reasonable administrative expenses (known as Direct Administrative Cost or "DAC") directly attributable to project worksheets. Examples of eligible costs include technical assistance provided by third parties. In addition, FEMA recently implemented a pilot program that will provide sub-recipients a flat rate 4% (in lieu of tracking costs to specific project worksheets) of the estimated total public assistance grants with additional financial incentives to close out completed projects. For example, if the County has a total FEMA eligible costs associated with the damage repairs equating to \$50 million, the County may receive DAC totaling \$2 million.

Contractor costs may be offset by DAC. CONTRACTOR's understanding is that California has opted in to the pilot program.
