Recommended Actions

a. Receive and file a report from the Public Health Department, acting as the Local EMS Agency (LEMSA), about the competitive process that the Board directed on October 1, 2019, to select a Contractor to provide emergency ambulance services for Santa Barbara County and to redefine exclusive operating areas as may be necessary, and;

b. Direct staff to identify funding for an outside consultant to develop and help conduct the ambulance Request for Proposal (RFP) and identify any additional resource needs, and to return to the Board for approval of a Budget Revision Request upon identification of funding for this aspect of the project.






RFP Advisory Meetings

- Mixture of County leadership, General Services, County Counsel, and Public Health
- Key Objectives:
 - Provide guidance on RFP Consultant Scope of Work
 - Provide guidance on RFP Consultant selection
 - Receive updates on progress of RFP for Ambulance Services
 - Provide "policy level" support and guidance





RFP: Timeline & Process (Overview)



RFP Consultant Selection Overview

Process

- Secure funding
- Develop Scope of Work for RFP Consultant
 - Support of RFP Advisory Group
- Release, response, and award
 - Support of RFP Advisory Group

Outcome

• RFP Consultant contract signed by June 1, 2020

- Timeline slip in funding, or selection process
- No responses





Ambulance Service RFP Requirements Development Overview

Process

- Guided by RFP Consultant and RFP Advisory Group
- Stakeholder feedback
- Development of RFP
- Update of EMS Plan

Outcome

• Submission of RFP and EMS Plan to CA EMS Authority by March 2021

- Timeline slip in development
- Timeline slip in CA EMSA approval





CA EMS Authority Review

Process

- CA EMS Authority reviews Ambulance Services RFP
- CA EMS Authority reviews EMS Plan
- Approval required prior to release

Outcome

 Approval from CA EMS Authority of EMS Plan and to release Ambulance Service RFP

- Changes required by CA EMS Authority
- Timeline slip in CA EMSA approval





Board of Supervisors Review

Process

 Review Ambulance Services RFP prior to release

Outcome

 Release of Ambulance Services RFP

- Changes required by Board of Supervisors
 - Will require CA EMS Authority review and approval process





Ambulance Service RFP Release, Response and Award

Process

- Ambulance Services RFP Released
- Bidders' conference
- RFP Responses submitted
- RFP Responses Scored
- RFP Award released
- Open period for award contest

Outcome

• Award of ambulance services provider

- No responsive bid responses
- RFP responses not acceptable to County
- Award contested





Ambulance Agreement Negotiation

Process

 Negotiate terms of contract with successful bidder of ambulance services RFP

Outcome

 Ambulance Services agreement that meets the needs of the County

Risks

 Unable to negotiate terms of agreement prior to expiration of current agreement





CA EMS Authority Review (Contract)

Process

 CA EMS Authority reviews Ambulance Services Agreement to ensure it is concurrent with ambulance services RFP

Outcome

• Approval from CA EMS Authority of Ambulance Services Contract

- Authority does not approve of contract
- Timeline slip in CA EMSA approval





Board of Supervisors Review (Contract)

Process

 Review Ambulance Services Agreement

Outcome

Signed Contract

Risks

- Changes required by Board of Supervisors
 - Will require CA EMS Authority review and approval process





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Ambulance Provider "Ramp Up" Period

Process

 Ambulance provider may need to procure staff, ambulances and other infrastructure to meet requirements set forth in agreement

Outcome

 Provider able to provide service as agreed in the contract and negotiation process

Risks

- Provider unable to procure resources to provide ambulance service
- Current contract with AMR expires prior to RFP awardee is ready to take over service





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Funding Research

- Staff will identify work required to support the ambulance service RFP process
- Staff will identify available resources to support the work to support the ambulance service porcess
- Staff will explore the current available funding for the RFP process
