

## MICROENTERPRISE HOME KITCHEN OPERATIONS

AB 626: EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2019

AB 377: EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2020

#### RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

- Receive and file a report on current food facility health permits and options related to Microenterprise Home Kitchens (AB 626 and AB 377).
- Provide one of the following policy directions with regard to implementing a Microenterprise Home Kitchen permitting program:
- Direct staff to prepare amendments to the Santa Barbara County Code authorizing Microenterprise Home Kitchen Operations to be permitted as food facilities in the county and return to the Board for further consideration; or
- Direct staff to take no further action at this time.
- Determine that the proposed actions are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5) as they are administrative actions that will not result in direct or indirect changes to the environment.



#### **SUMMARY**

- Allows for small-scale, direct food sales to consumers from home-based food facilities;
- Administered and implemented by Environmental Health Services;
- Commercial zoning & building code exemptions;
- Modifications to equipment and standards;
- Is an opt-in bill for counties;
- City participation is determined by county's decision.



#### POLICY DIRECTION

• Shall Environmental Health
Services seek an ordinance from
Board of Supervisors regarding
Microenterprise Home Kitchen
Operations (MEHKOs) within Santa
Barbara County?



#### **OPTIONS**

- Option 1: Do not authorize
   Microenterprise Home Kitchen
   Operations in Santa Barbara County;
- Option 2: Authorize Microenterprise
   Home Kitchen Operations in Santa
   Barbara County, which would include all
   areas within its jurisdiction, including all
   cities within the county.



#### OPTION 1: DO NOT OPT IN

#### **Pros**

- Simple implementation
- No additional impact on residential neighborhoods

#### Cons

- Limits access to homebased entrepreneurship
- Enforcement challenges





#### OPTION 2: OPT IN

#### **Pros**

- Increased entrepreneurship opportunities
- Uniform food safety practices within county
- Pathway to compliance for existing unpermitted home operations

#### Cons

- Cities will have no decision-making power with county opt-in decision
- Potential impacts to residential neighborhoods
