### LONG RANGE PLANNING DIVISION FY 2019-2020 - RECAP

- Goal: complete existing projects and begin work on new countywide projects
- Completed Projects:
  - 2019 General Package of Ordinance Amendments
  - Cannabis Land Use Ordinance Amendments
  - Hoop Structures Ordinance Amendments
  - Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) Fee Buildout Analysis

### LONG RANGE PLANNING DIVISION FY 2019-2020 — CHALLENGES

- Projects added to the Work Program:
  - Two Packages of Cannabis Ordinance Amendments
  - TIP Fee Buildout Analysis
  - New State housing laws (e.g., ADUs)
  - Guidance for Implementation of Hoops Ordinance
- Additional tasks added to existing projects in the Work Program
- Assisted with cannabis permitting activities
- 4 vacancies in FY 2018-2019 and Planner II
   vacancy as of January 2020



## LONG RANGE PLANNING DIVISION FY 2019-2020 — CHALLENGES

- Projects placed on-hold:
  - Agricultural Tiered Permitting Ordinance Amendments
  - Farmstays Ordinance Amendments
  - Short-Term Rentals Coastal Zoning Ordinance Amendments
  - State Housing and Density Bonus Laws Amendments



#### Considerations for Developing the FY 2020-2023 Work Program



- Considerations when developing the Work Program:
  - Shift from 1- to 3-year planning timeframe
  - Decision-maker, public, and interest group requests
  - Multi-year projects require continued support for completion
  - Budgetary constraints
  - State mandated projects
  - Focus on Countywide projects

- Continue to prioritize completion of existing projects

- Requests:
  - Expansion from 11 to 13 FTEs
  - Use of consultant services
- If no expansion, then identify projects to postpone; avoid:
  - Mandated work
  - Grant-funded work
  - Projects that are substantially complete

- Next Steps:
  - Budget workshops April 13, 2020
  - Budget adoption June 9 & 11, 2020



#### RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

- a) Receive a report on the proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2023 Work Program;
- b) Allocate the requested funding and staff resources for an increase in funding and two authorized positions, or maintain funding and positions at current levels, to continue to provide required services, conduct operations, and work on (1) projects with remaining work from the FY 2019-2020 Work Program, and (2) recommended, new projects, as the projects with remaining work from FY 2019-2020 are completed, subject to approval of the Planning and Development Department's (P&D's) budget;



#### RECOMMENDED ACTIONS (CONT.)

- c) Provide direction to the County Executive Office (CEO) regarding any desired increase in funding and authorized positions for the Long Range Planning Division for inclusion in the FY 2020-2021 Recommended Budget; and
- d) Determine that the Board's action is not a "project" that is subject to environmental review pursuant to the State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines [§ 15378(b)(5)].
