Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Coast Valley Substance Abuse Treatment Center (CVSATC) (a local vendor) to provide drug and alcohol, cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) services, and clean and sober housing in Lompoc and Santa Maria, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$93,868;
- B. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Good Samaritan Shelter (Good Sam) (a local vendor) to provide drug and alcohol treatment, Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC), clean and sober housing, and residential withdrawal management with a total contract amount not to exceed \$538,874;
- C. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Community Solutions Incorporated (CSI) (a local vendor) to provide Batterer's Intervention Program (BIP), CBT, and reentry support services in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$444,443;
- D. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (CADA) (a local vendor) to provide

drug and alcohol services, CBT, Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC), residential withdrawal management services, and residential alcohol and drug treatment with a total contract amount not to exceed \$198,093;

- E. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Goodwill Industries of Ventura and Santa Barbara, Inc. (Goodwill) (a local vendor) to provide employment development and subsidized employment services, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$178,880;
- F. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with People Assisting the Homeless (PATH) (a local vendor) to provide clean and sober housing, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$45,000;
- G. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara (Sanctuary) (a local vendor) to provide enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population, as well as in custody evidence-based mental health treatment services to inmates in the Santa Barbara County Jail, including related re-entry services, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$55,000;
- H. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Community Action Commission of Santa Barbara County (CAC) (a local vendor) to provide Helpline reentry resource referrals for justice-involved individuals, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$17,700;
- I. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with The Salvation Army Transition and Recovery Center (TSATRC) (a local vendor) to provide clean and sober housing, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$40,000;
- J. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer or designee to approve subsequent line-item budget changes to Attachment B-1 of each Agreement in an amount not to exceed 10% of the stated line-item budgeted amounts for each service, as long as the total contract amount of each Agreement is not increased, and as long as the total budgeted amounts by each funding source are not exceeded;
- K. Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities of funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

Summary Text:

Through funding provided by Senate Bill 678 (SB678) and Assembly Bill 109 (AB109), also known as the Public Safety Realignment Act (Realignment), the attached Agreements with community based organizations provide a variety of services and interventions to high risk and Realigned offenders including cognitive behavioral treatment (CBT), drug and alcohol treatment services, residential withdrawal management, employment development skills, subsidized employment, clean and sober housing, inpatient residential alcohol and drug treatment, enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population and evidence-based treatment services and related re-entry services to inmates with mental health diagnoses that are housed in the Santa Barbara County Jail. The services for Realigned offenders recommended in these Agreements and related expenditures were endorsed by the Executive Committee of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) and included in the County's FY 2020-2021 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 12, 2020. There are no proposed changes to the SB678 strategies at this time and associated services and outcomes were reviewed by the CCP on April 3, 2020.

Background:

SB678 provides funding to probation departments based on achieved reductions in the failure rate of adult felony probationers. The State defines a failure as an adult probationer who was sent to state prison for a revocation of probation, as well as adult felony probationers sent to state prison for a conviction of a new felony offense. Through successful reductions in the failure rate, SB678 funding is being received from the State. With the implementation of Realignment and the subsequent statutory changes which significantly impacted the eligibility of felony probationers for revocation to state prison, Penal Code Section 1233.1 was added to direct the development of a revised SB678 formula.

Realignment transferred responsibility for specified lower level inmates and parolees from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to counties. This change was implemented on October 1, 2011. The CCP in each county is required to develop a Public Safety Realignment Act Plan for the subject population. Santa Barbara County's FY 2020-2021 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan, as developed by the CCP and endorsed by the Executive Committee of the CCP, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 12, 2020. The services for Realigned offenders recommended in these Agreements and related expenditures were included in the County's FY 2020-2021 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan.

Execution of the CVSATC Agreement will provide services to felony probationers through SB678 and Realigned offenders. Specifically, CVSATC will provide evidence-based drug and alcohol group services, CBT, and clean and sober housing.

Execution of the Good Sam Agreement will provide evidence-based services to both the SB678 and Realigned populations. Good Sam will provide evidence-based drug and alcohol group services, ROSC group services, clean and sober housing, and residential withdrawal management beds.

Execution of the CSI Agreement will provide services to felony probationers through SB678 and Realigned offenders. Specifically, CSI will provide Batterer’s Intervention Program (BIP), CBT, and reentry support services in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara.

Execution of the CADA Agreement will provide services to felony probationers through SB678 and Realigned offenders. Specifically, CADA will provide evidence-based drug and alcohol group services, CBT, ROSC group services, residential drug and alcohol treatment, and residential withdrawal management beds.

Execution of the Goodwill Agreement will provide employment development and subsidized employment services to felony probationers through SB678 and Realigned offenders.

Execution of the People Assisting The Homeless Agreement will provide clean and sober housing services to Realigned offenders.

Execution of the Sanctuary Agreement will provide services to Realigned offenders. Specifically, Sanctuary will provide enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population. Additionally, Sanctuary will provide evidence-based treatment services and related re-entry services to inmates with mental health diagnoses that are housed in the Santa Barbara County Jail.

Execution of the CAC Agreement will provide Helpline service referrals for justice-involved individuals along with online resources to assist in providing information for re-entry services within the community.

Execution of The Salvation Army Transition and Recovery Center Agreement will provide clean and sober housing services to Realigned offenders.

Narrative:

The attached nine (9) Agreements for Adult Probation program services are fully funded by State funding sources, which include Realignment revenue in an amount of \$1,264,288 and SB678 revenue in an amount of \$347,570 for a combined total funding of \$1,611,858. Execution of the nine (9) Agreements will not increase the General Fund Contribution to the Probation Department.

Of the attached nine (9) total Agreements, eight (8) Agreements are Board Contract renewals and one (1) additional Board Contract is included as attachment (I) for The Salvation Army Transition and Recovery Center. Some modifications to the services and data collection expectations have been incorporated into the Agreements to ensure they are consistent with the approved FY 2020-2021 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan.
