That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve the bylaws of the San Antonio Basin Water District; and
- b) Determine that the above action involves government organization or administrative activity which will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(5).

#### **Summary Text:**

The newly formed San Antonio Basin Water District (District) approved their bylaws on May 19, 2020. On June 22, 2020, the District's counsel submitted the attached letter requesting the Board of Supervisors approve the District's bylaws. Pursuant to Water Code section 35301, the District is required to prepare bylaws for the written approval of the Board of Supervisors. The bylaws are required to provide for the manner of voting, the qualifications and duties of the officers, the compensation of officers, the location of the District office and how to change the location, the method of amending or repealing the bylaws, and penalties for violating the bylaws. (Water Code § 35303-35304.) These matters are all addressed in the bylaws submitted by the District. (See Attachment A.) Once approved by the Board the bylaws may be recorded and enforced. (Water Code § 35306.)

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## **Background:**

The San Antonio Basin Water District (District) was formed as a California Water District in accordance with Water Code section 34000 *et seq.*, following a landowner voter election held on April 7, 2020. (See <a href="https://countyofsb.org/care/elections/voting/upcoming/april-7-2020.sbc">https://countyofsb.org/care/elections/voting/upcoming/april-7-2020.sbc</a>.) The District overlies the San Antonio Creek Groundwater Basin (Basin). Formation was initiated by petition, signed by the holders of title to a majority of land within the proposed boundaries. (See LAFCO Commission Resolution No. 19-03; <a href="http://sblafco.org/asset.c/1153">http://sblafco.org/asset.c/1153</a>.) The District was formed to participate as a member of the Groundwater Sustainability Agency for the Basin.
