

Background

- May 6, 2019: Land Use Permit
 (LUP) for 37 acres of outdoor
 cannabis cultivation approved by
 the Planning & Development
 Director
- May 15, 2019: LUP Appeal to the Planning Commission filed
- November 6, 2019: Planning
 Commission denies the appeal and grants de novo approval of the LUP for 12.75 acres of cannabis cultivation
- November 18, 2019: LUP Appeal to the BOS is filed



Background Continued

- March 10, 2020: Applicant and appellant requested continuance from your BOS to hearing of April 21, 2020
- April 17 and 19, 2020: Applicant requested to withdraw LUP application, then Applicant rescinded request to withdraw and asked to proceed with LUP request
- April 20, 2020: P&D requested continuance from April 21, 2020 to May 5, 2020 to fulfill noticing requirements given the Applicant's updated request
- May 1 and 4, 2020: Lack of authorization from the Property Owner, therefore P&D staff requested withdrawal of the item from May 5, 2020 BOS agenda

Lack of Owner Authorization

- Staff has not received proof of authorization from the Property Owner in order for the Applicant to proceed with the proposed project on the subject property
- Therefore, staff is recommending that the BOS deny the LUP because it is not consistent with Land Use and Development Code requirements

Recommended Actions

Staff recommends that your Board take the following actions:

- a) Deny the appeal, Case No. 19APL-00000-00032;
- b) Make the required findings for denial of the project, Case No. 18LUP-00000-00351, included as Attachment 1, including California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) findings; and
- c) Determine that denial of the project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15270(a).
- d) Deny the project de novo, Case No. 18LUP-00000-00351
