That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve, ratify and authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture for services related to the Sudden Oak Death Program in the County of Santa Barbara for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 in the amount of \$8,747.91
- B. Determine that the above action involves government funding mechanisms and/or fiscal activities and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section CCR 15378(b)(4).

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors to approve, ratify, and authorize an agreement with the CDFA to receive reimbursement for the SOD Program. This ongoing program ensures that Santa Barbara County is free from *Phytophthora ramorum*, the causal agent of the plant disease SOD. Reimbursable activities in the form of response to detections and reporting are required to enable commercial nurseries that ship hosts of the disease out of state to meet the requirements of the Federal quarantine.

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Background:

This program has been funded for many years and the funding is anticipated to continue. The ongoing funding is made available through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is distributed through the CDFA to the County Agricultural Commissioner's Office. SOD is a plant disease that has not been found in Santa Barbara County, but has become established in coastal California from Humboldt County south to Monterey County. The disease is fatal to a specific group of plants, including oaks, redwoods, and bay trees, and has caused significant damage to the forests in northern and central California. The USDA has implemented a Federal Domestic Quarantine to prevent the spread of *Phytophthora ramorum* by requiring testing of host plants before they are shipped out of state.
