Governor's Road Map

Resilience Roadmap Stages

STAGE 1: Safety and Preparedness

Making essential workforce environment as safe as possible.

STAGE 2: Lower Risk Workplaces

Creating opportunities for lower risk sectors to adapt and re-open.

Modified school programs and childcare re-open.

STAGE 3: Higher Risk Workplaces

Creating opportunities for higher risk sectors to adapt and re-open.

STAGE 4: End of Stay-At-Home Order

Return to expanded workforce in highest risk workplaces.

Requires Therapeutics.



Move to Stage 2: Lower Risk Workplaces

- > CA move into Stage 2 on Friday, May 8
- > Move into Stage 2 will be gradual and only include certain industries
- Expanded retail with curbside pickup & associated manufacturing & supply chains
 - Examples: Furniture, bookstores, clothing, florists, sporting goods, toys, shoes
- What is NOT included at this time?
 - Offices (can telework)
 - Seated dining at restaurants
 - Shopping malls



Accelerated Stage 2: Regional Variation

- Counties can move more quickly through Stage 2, if they attest that they meet the State's readiness criteria
- Counties must create and submit a readiness plan which will be publicly available
- What will be needed for attestation?
 - Readiness Plan
 - Containment Plan



Governor's Anticipated Readiness Indicators

Preliminary

1.Prevalence of disease

- 14 days of declining prevalence of disease
- Less than 10% of tests are positive

2. Testing capacity

- 1 per 1,000 population
- Testing sites within 30 minutes

3.Contract tracing

- Ability to do 3 times the daily positives over a 7-day period
- Need plan to support vulnerable populations in isolation
- Isolation and quarantine orders can be issued within 24 hours

4. Hospital capacity

Ability to surge 25% in facility and labor

5. Vulnerable population

- Protection in place for SNFs & LT care facilities
- Testing availability



Governor's Anticipated Containment Indicators

Preliminary

1. Testing:

- Increase to 2/1000;
- Access in 30 minutes
- Community surveillance

2. Contact tracing

- Ratio of contact tracers must reflect diversity of general population
- Culturally competent
- Be able to handle a 3-fold increase
- Ability to manage low-income cases

3. Vulnerable Populations

- Congregate care
- Homeless shelters
- Corrections

4. Acute care surge

- Daily tracking
- Adequate supply of PPEs
- 5. Track workplace exposure
- 6. Regional approach



SBC Readiness based on Governor's indicators

Prevalence of disease:
14 days of declining

- Number of active cases steadily declining
- Percent positive: 10%

County ratio 11/1000

- At least 5,023 tested county wide via health care system
- Harvard ratio 152/100,000 or 684 per day; current at least 126/day
- Starting this week additional 390 a day for 60 days 5 days a week

Contract tracing
Ability to do 3 times the daily
positives
over a 7-day period,
Support vulnerable populations

- Core disease investigators, contact tracers, monitors teams in place
- Contact tracing establishing and ramping up to meet demand
- County developed curriculum and training program shared regionally
- Additional nurses, investigators, and tracers secured More coming



SBC Readiness based on Governor's indicators

Hospital capacity ability to surge 25% in facility and labor

- Surge capacity in hospitals available 699 beds
- ACS plan established

Vulnerable population: protection in place for SNFs, LT care facilities, Testing availability

- Unsheltered populations housed in congregate and non congregate settings
- SNF plan in plan in place to monitor and test



SBC Readiness based on HO Order

- > Health Officer Order 2020-8: Essential Businesses Within SBC
 - Guidelines for social distancing
 - Guidelines for operations
 - Guideline for COVID-19 Self-Evaluation (Attachment D)
 - Social Distancing Protocol (Attachment E)
 - Measures to protect employee health
 - Measures to prevent crowds from gathering
 - Measures to keep people at least 6 feet apart
 - Measures to prevent unnecessary contact
 - Measures to increase sanitation



State sponsored community testing

- State vendor Optumserve will provide 132 test/day X 5 days = 660 tests per site per week
- >~17,160 tests total
- > Three sites selected within the given zip codes
 - Santa Maria: Santa Maria Fairpark
 - Lompoc: Anderson Recreation Center
 - Santa Barbara: Earl Warren Showgrounds
- Between all three sites: 7 days/week; all open on Sat & Sun
- 7 am to 7 pm








DAILY CHANGE in TOTAL CASES


