






NEW CASES IN PAST 2 WEEKS: City-by-City










AGE DISTRIBUTION OF CASES

Retroactive CDM: Testing positivity








Retroactive CDM: Case rate per 100,000

School Waivers



TK-6 Waiver Process

- ► Letter will be sent to all school superintendents by end of day on Tuesday
- Application for waiver being finalized
- Email account being set up
- > Public Health will begin accepting waiver application on Friday



TK-6 Waiver Process

- ➤ Superintendent must submit evidence of consultation with labor and parent organizations.
- > Superintendent must publish the elementary school reopening plans on the website of the local educational agency.
- > The local health officer and team will review the application, the reopening plan, and local community epidemiological data.
- ➤ The local health officer consults with CDPH to make a determination whether to grant or deny the waiver.

DATA & REOPENINGS

- Published data differs based on methodology and lag time.
- > Efforts between state teams to reconcile data.
- > Efforts between CDPH and SBCPHD to reconcile data.
- ➤ Goal: to be removed from County Monitoring List.
- >Additional schools can reopen for in-person learning if county is off list for 14 days.
- >Additional sectors can only be opened via new state health officer order.



Action needed to reduce transmission of disease

- Wear face coverings
- Maintain 6 ft physical distancing
- Avoid gatherings and crowds
