


## Santa Barbara County COVID-19 By The Numbers





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
#### **NEW CASES IN PAST 2 WEEKS: City-by-City**



## Average Number of Tests per Day




#### 14-Day Average Case Rate (3 Day Lag) for CA, Santa Barbara
