SECTOR CHANGES EFFECTIVE 8/31/20:

- Hair Salons and Barbershops open indoors with modifications
- All Retail open indoors with modifications at max 25% capacity
- Shopping Malls open indoors with modifications at max 25% capacity, closed common areas and closed food courts.

ASSESSMENT FOR TIER CHANGE IS EVERY TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 8, 2020 - TIER 1 PURPLE SEPTEMBER 15, 2020 - TBD

Have to be in new Tier for 3 weeks before industry sector changes occur

- Small Business Grants (SB Foundation)
 - \$309,000 Grant Funding
 - Up to \$7,500 per business
 - RISE Self Certified
 - Closed August 31, 2020
 - 35 Applications Processed



County Sponsored Community Resource Programs – Unincorporated Areas



- 200 Households
- Launched last week
- \$1,200 each individual/family
- Individual/household must attest they will self-isolate for 14 days.



County Sponsored Community Resource Programs – Unincorporated Areas



- Rental Assistance Program (United Way CARES)
 - 600 Households Total \$2 million
 - \$1,000/month up to 3 months
 - Over 220 Applications Received with 111 Approved to date
